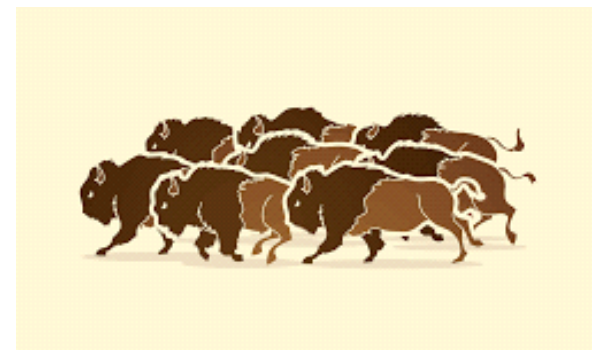
Yellowstone National Park - A Deeper Look

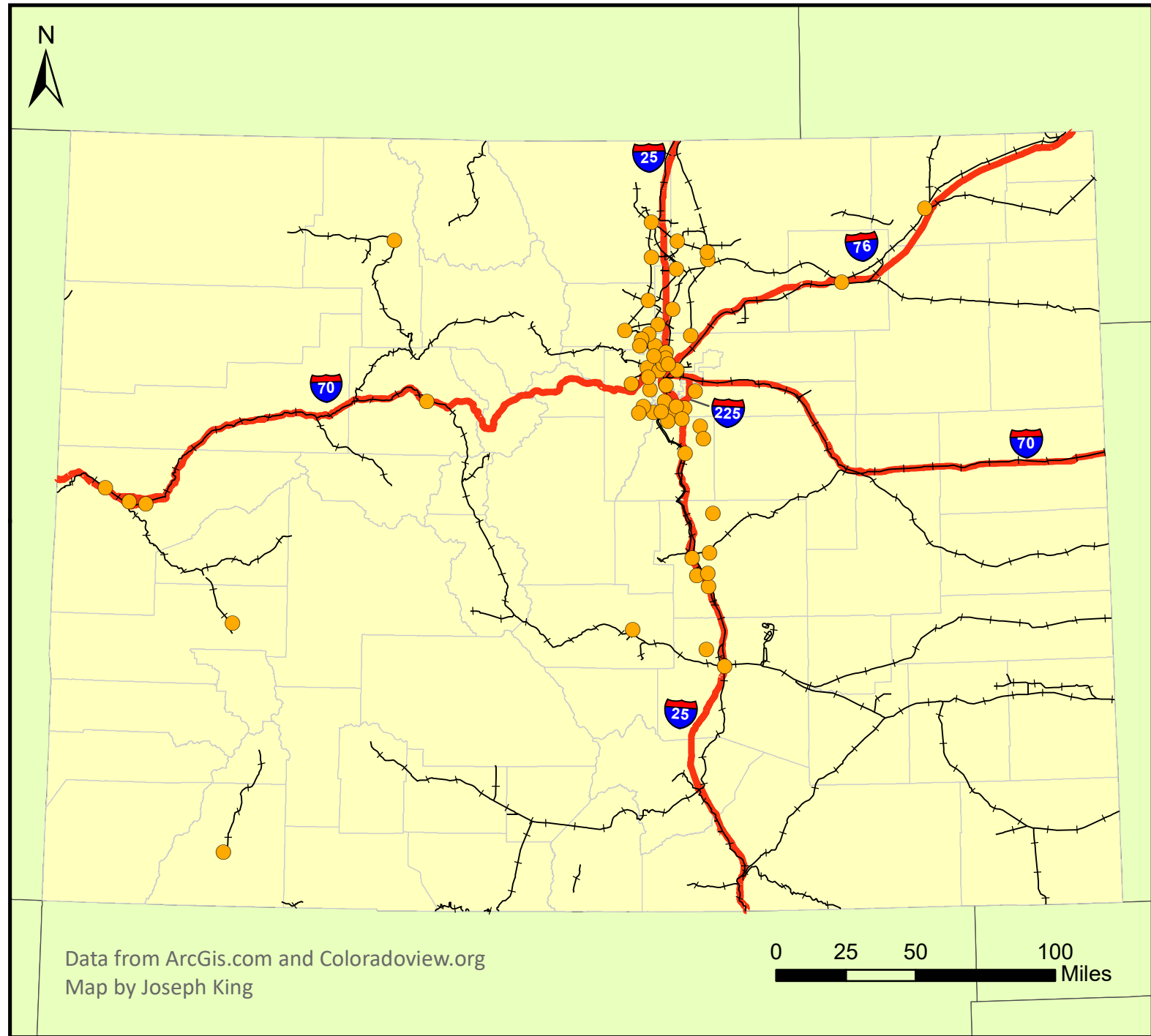
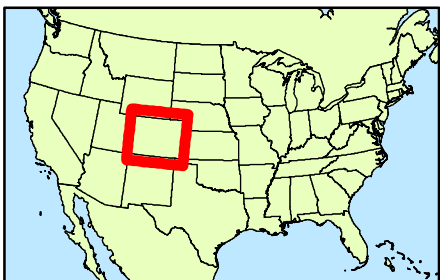
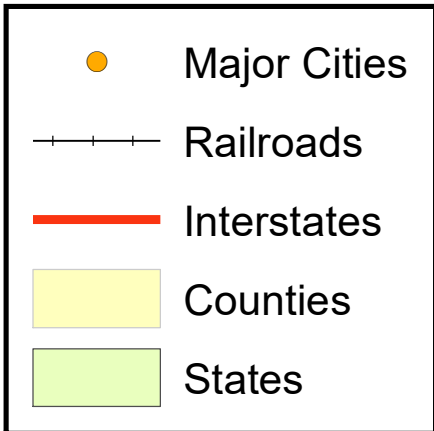
From [nps.gov](https://www.nps.gov/), "Yellowstone is the only place in the United States where bison have lived continuously since prehistoric times. Yellowstone bison are exceptional because they comprise the nation's largest bison population on public land and are among the few bison herds that have not been hybridized through interbreeding with cattle. Unlike most other herds, this population has thousands of individuals that are allowed to roam relatively freely over the expansive landscape of Yellowstone National Park and some nearby areas of Montana. They also exhibit wild behavior like their ancient ancestors, congregating during the breeding season to compete for mates, as well as migration and exploration that result in the use of new habitat areas. These behaviors have enabled the successful restoration of a population that was on the brink of extinction very recently"

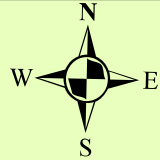

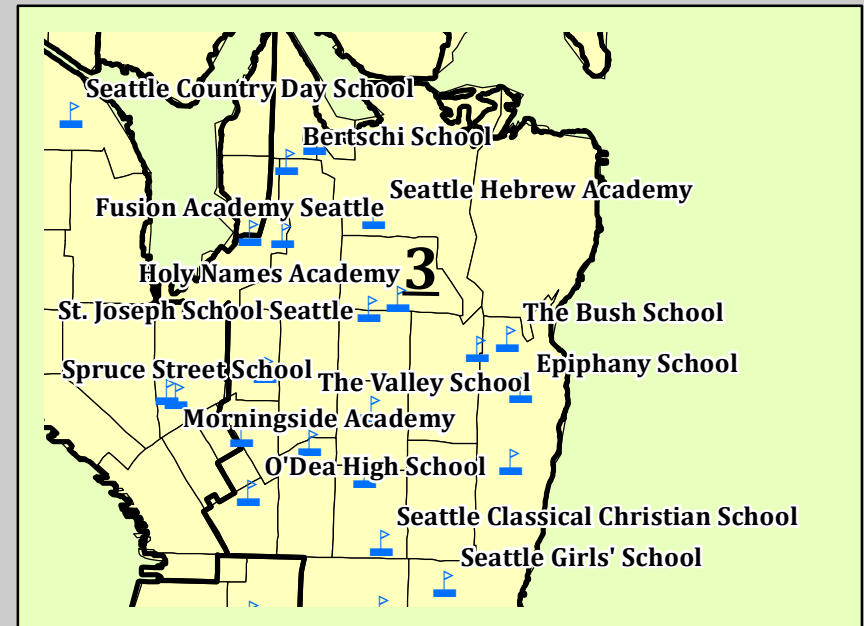

Staying Active in College: Durham, North Carolina

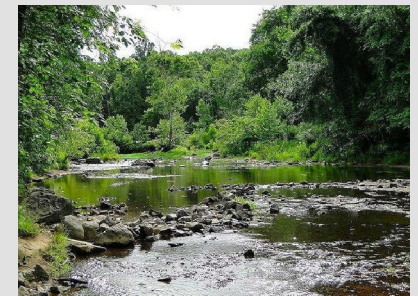

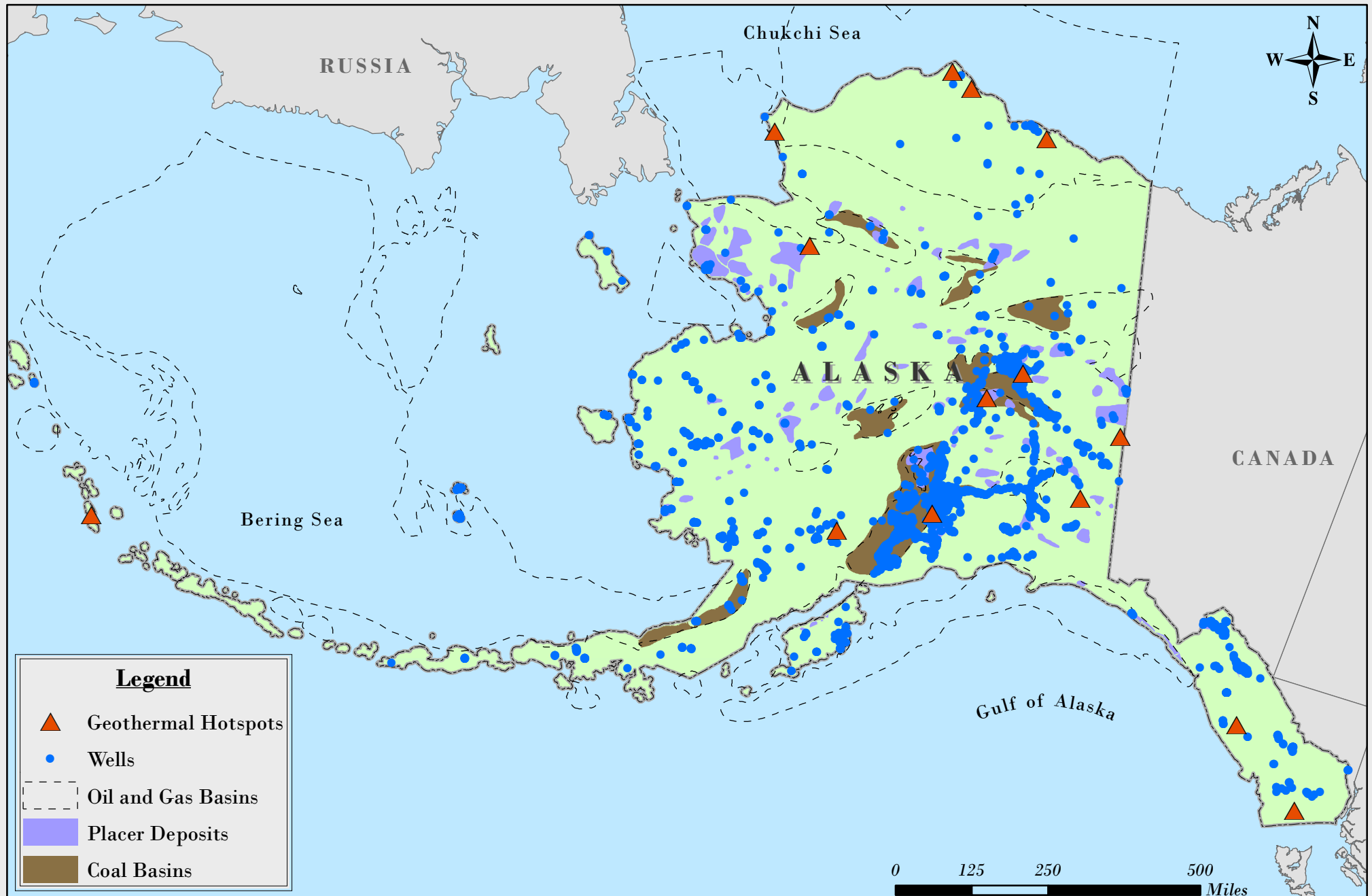

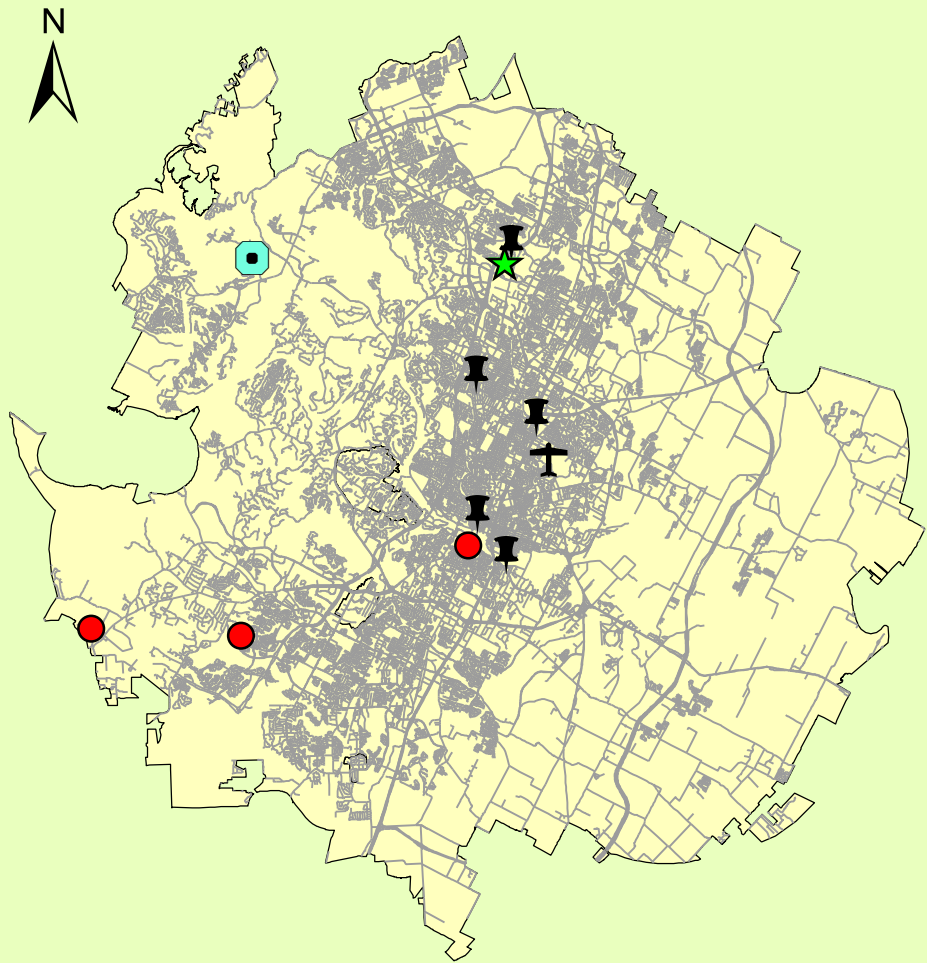


Alaska is rich in history and in natural resources.

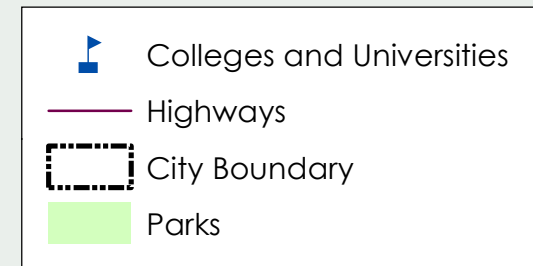




Colleges and Universities in Seattle, Washington

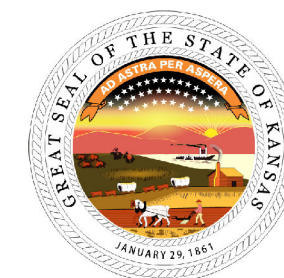

South Lake Union opened the public in 2007 and ranges 1.3 miles while First Hill Alignment opened in 2016 and ranges 2.5 miles. Approximately 5000 residents use the streetcar per day which strives to lower pollution rates by encouraging use of public transit.



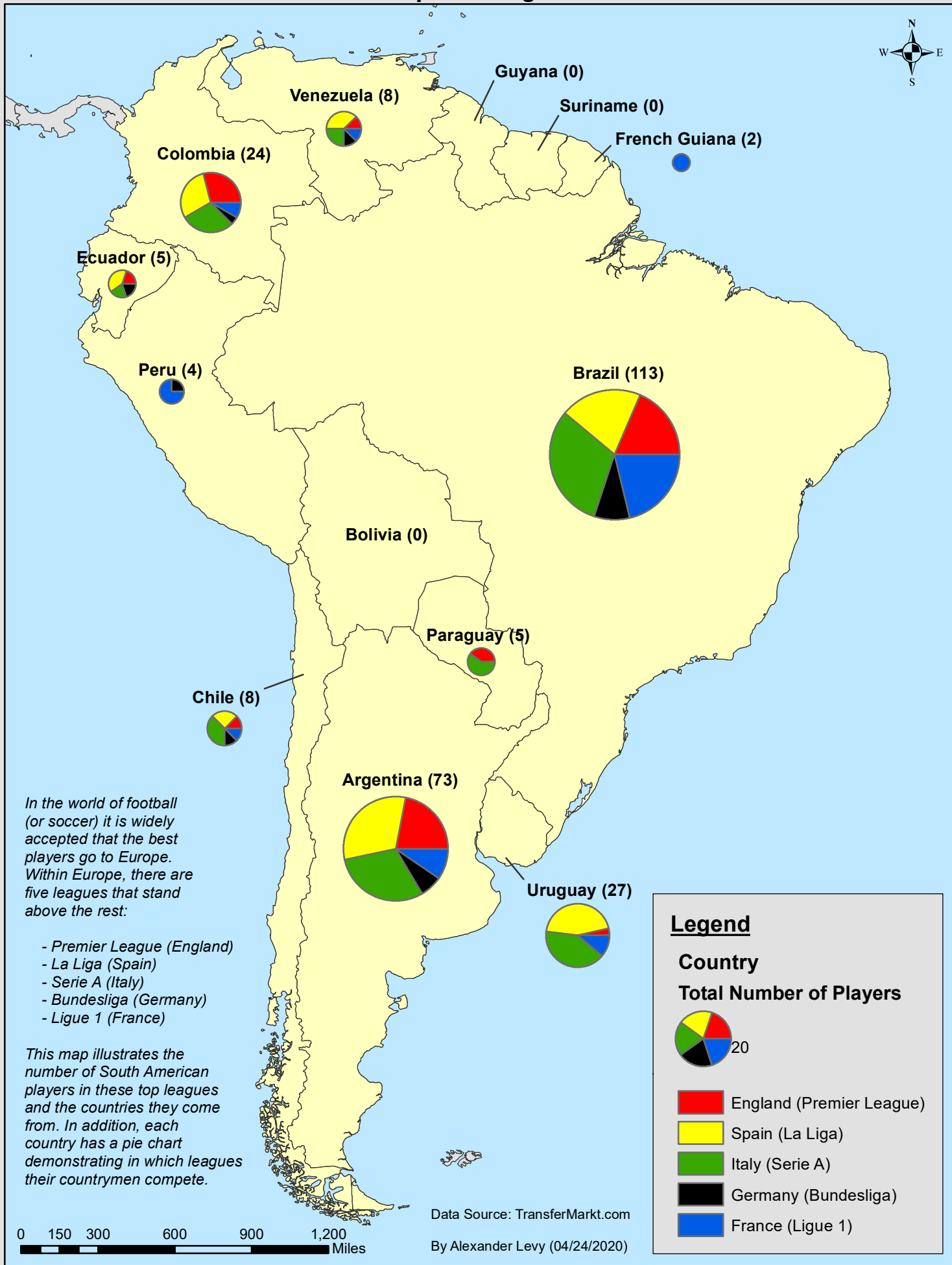

COVID-19 Fatalities in Georgia

COVID-19 is an infectious disease which has caused a global pandemic in 2020. So far, the disease has claimed 211,000 lives across the world, and many cases/deaths are still being reported. Major US news outlets often focus on the number of cases and deaths per state, which may not show the entire story.

The objective of this map is to use a more informative approach to visualizing COVID-19 deaths. In this map, fatalities in Georgia are represented in dots and are distributed on a county level. In addition, the deaths per county is compared to the county population to determine the overall rate of death.

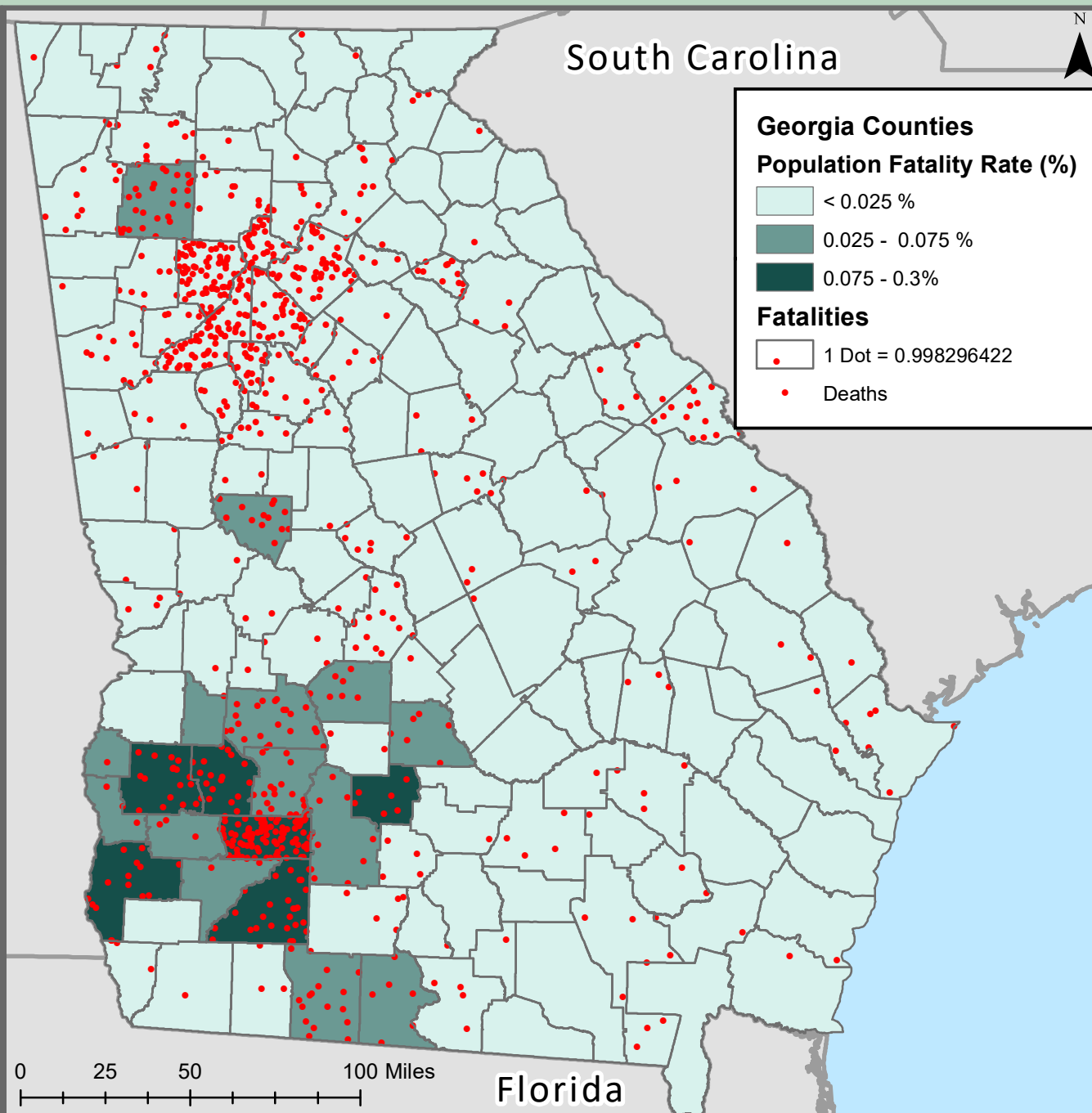

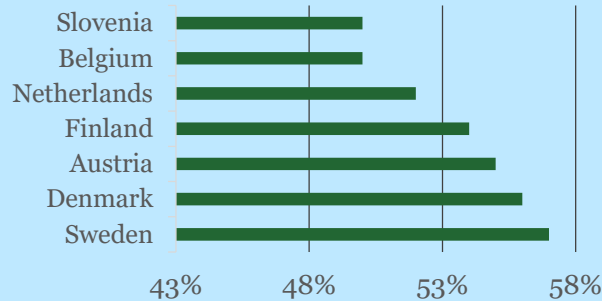
Paying a Higher Price - Personal Income Tax in Europe 2019

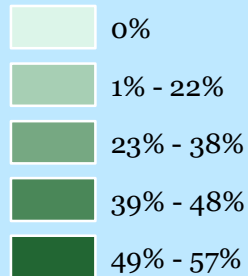

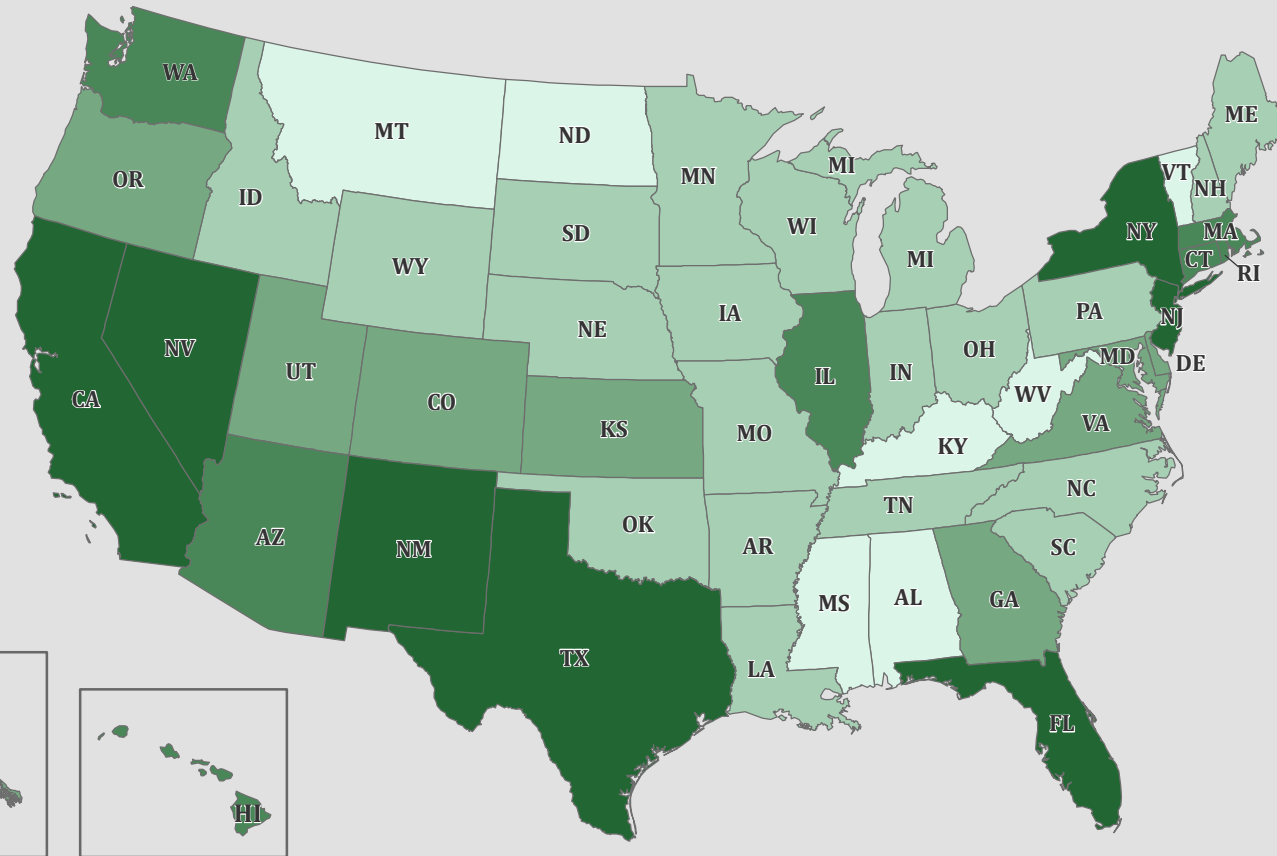
CORONAVIRUS IN THE UNITED STATES



“CDC is responding to a pandemic of respiratory disease spreading from person to person caused by a novel (new) coronavirus. Early on, many of the patients at the epicenter of the outbreak in Wuhan, Hubei Province, China had some link to a large seafood and live animal market, suggesting animal-to-person spread. Later, a growing number of patients reportedly did not have exposure to animal markets, indicating person-to-person spread. Person-to-person spread was subsequently reported outside Hubei and in countries outside China, including in the United States. Most international destinations now have ongoing community spread with the virus that causes COVID-19, as does the United States. Community spread means some people have been infected and it is not known how or where they became exposed.” - Source: cdc.gov



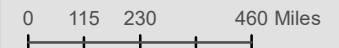

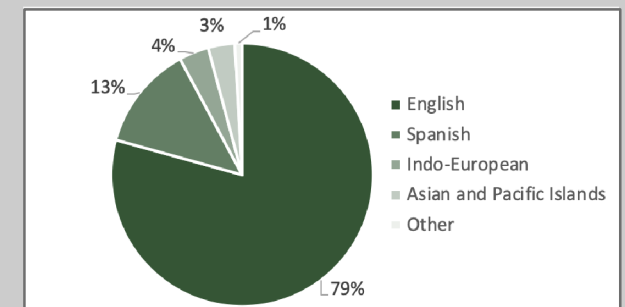

U.S. Breakdown of Language Groups Spoken at Home





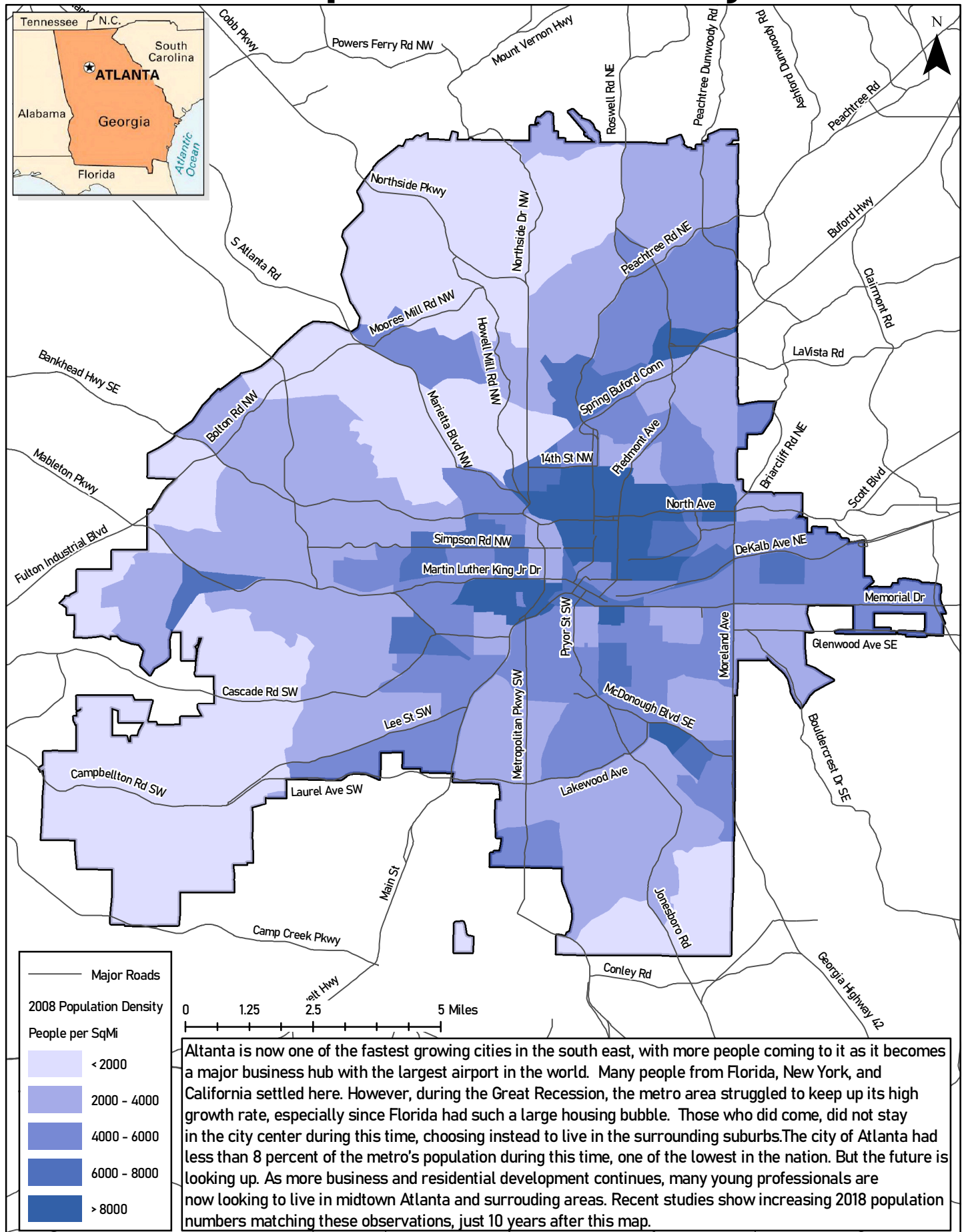
Georgia Public Housing by Congressional District

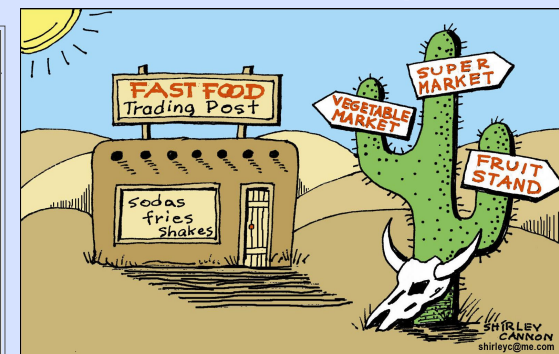
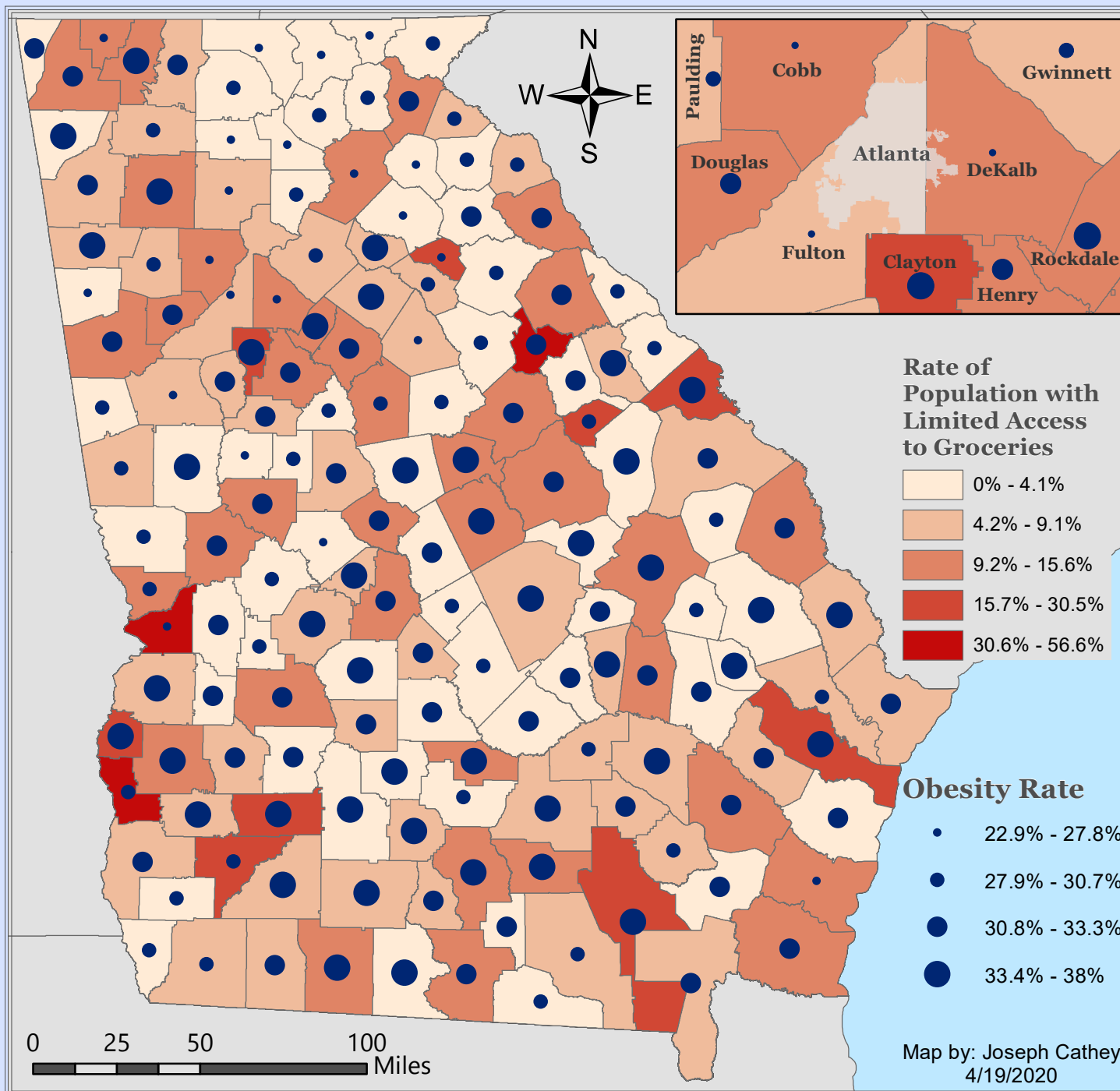

The USDA estimates that 23.5 million Americans live within food deserts, where there is limited access to affordable, healthy, and fresh food from grocery stores. Populations in these areas are more likely to rely on fast food and convenience stores for their food sources, leading to obesity and other health issues. This map shows the relationship between the rate of populations with limited access to grocery stores and obesity rates in Georgia Counties. 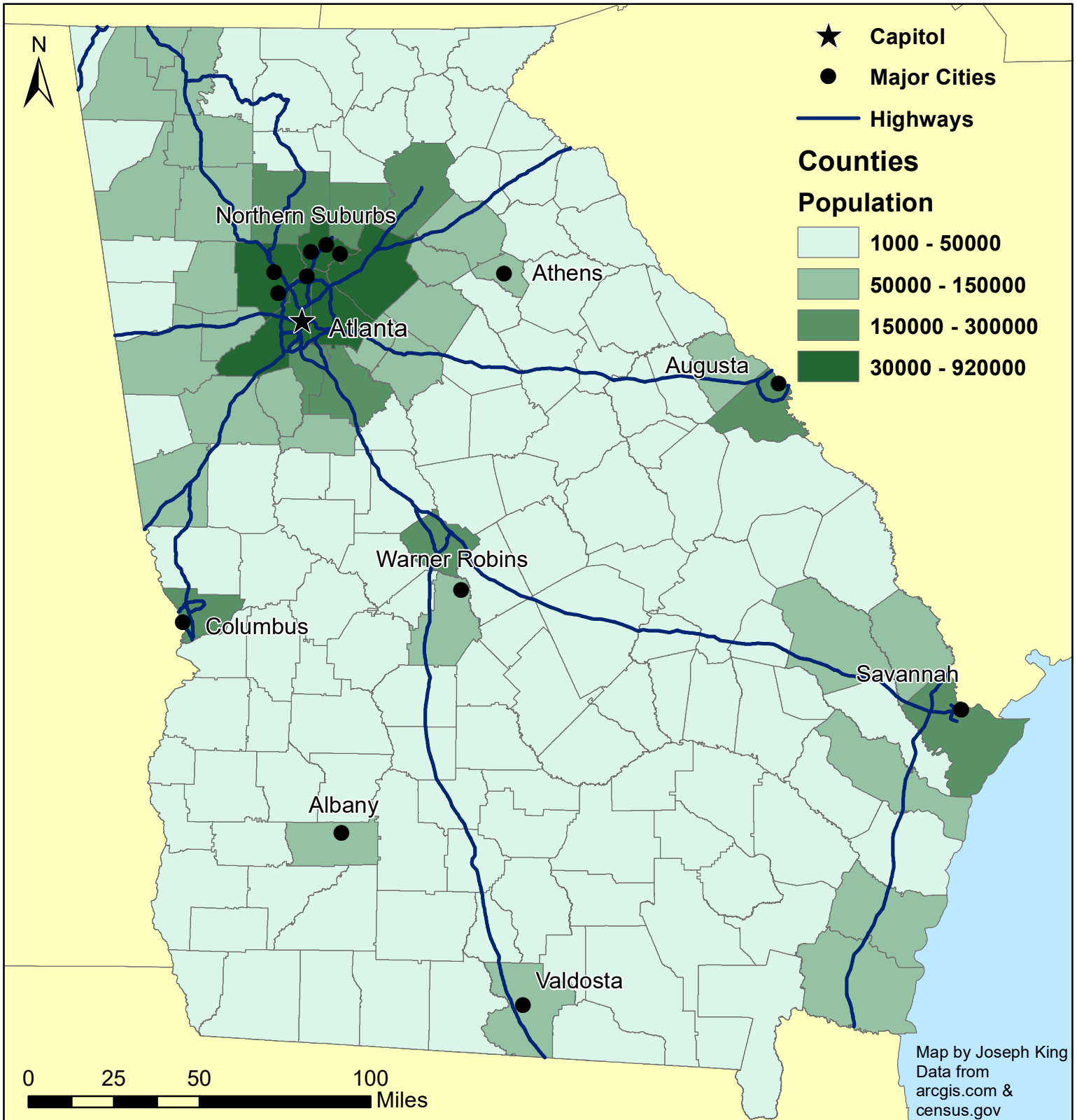

Georgia's population is heavily centered around the Atlanta Area, where several major cities are located that many consider to be suburbs of Atlanta, despite their large populations in and of themselves.



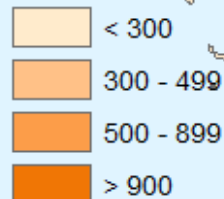
Rail Density in the European Union

Over the last 25 years the Commission has been very active in proposing restructuring the European rail transport market in order to strengthen the position of railways vis-à-vis other transport modes. Rising traffic demand, congestion, security of energy supply and climate change are some of the major issues that the European Union and the wider world are facing. Tackling these challenges will require the railway sector to take on a larger share of the transport demand in the next few decades.

Mining in Western Australia

Western Australia's mining business is thriving with over 100 billion dollars in profits. There are 1,170 mines in western Australia with the highest proportion being located on fault lines for easy access to minerals, metals, and stones. Iron is the most common valuable resource profiting the region of Pilbara with over 63 billion dollars.

Iron is the reason for Pilbara's top status as the most profitable region for mining followed by Goldfields-Esperance and Perth. The Kimberley region has the lowest mining profits with the West and East Kimberley making only 289 million combined.

New Cancer Cases in America (2016)

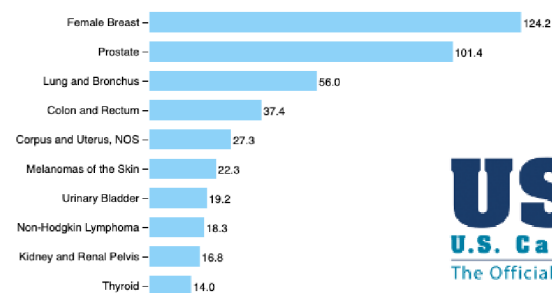


Cases per 100,000 People

Top 10 Cancers by Rates of New Cancer Cases

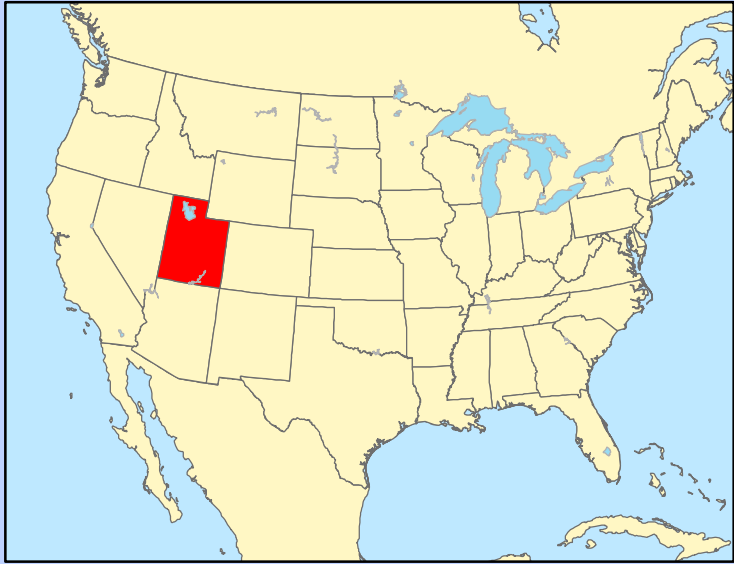

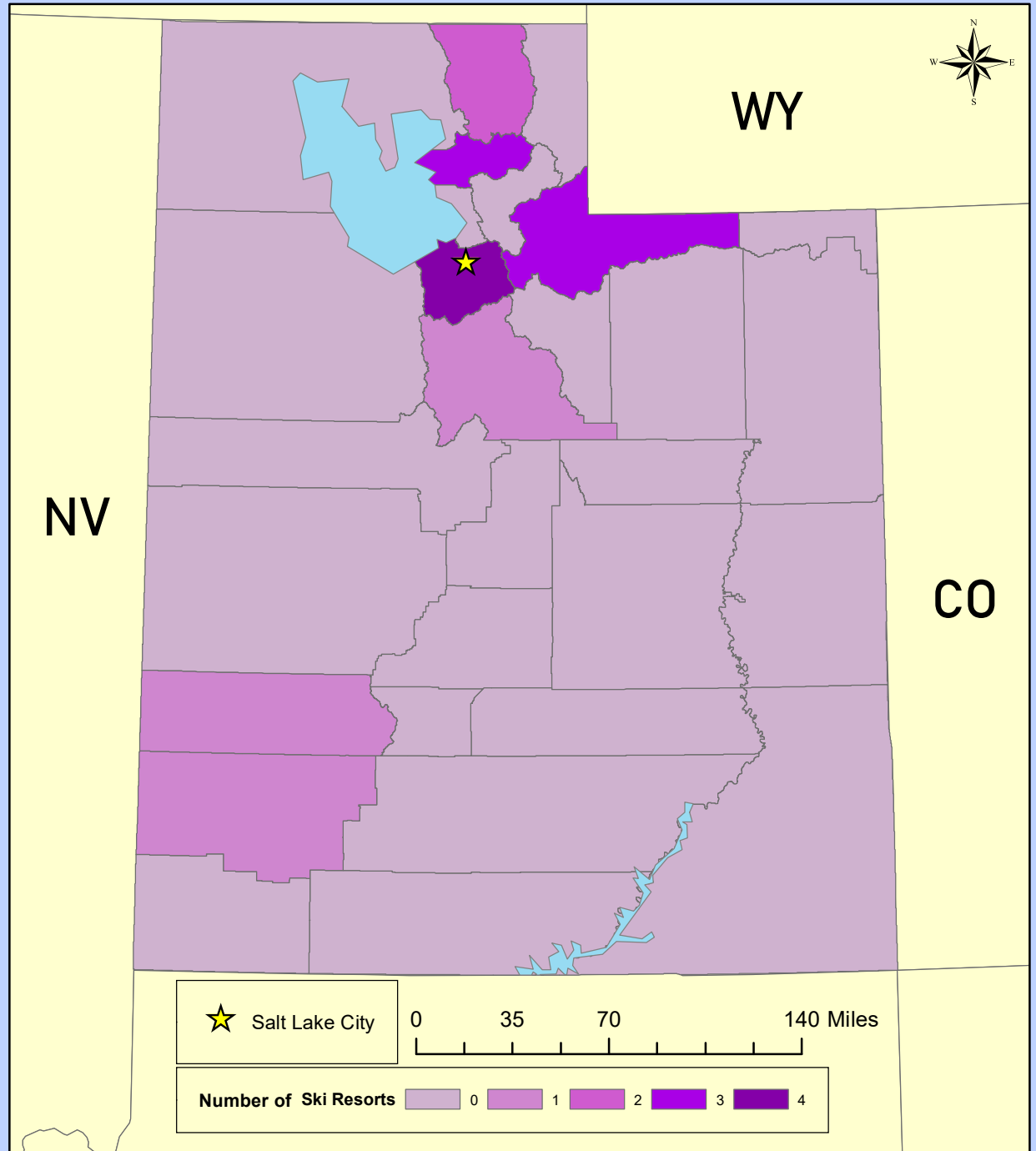

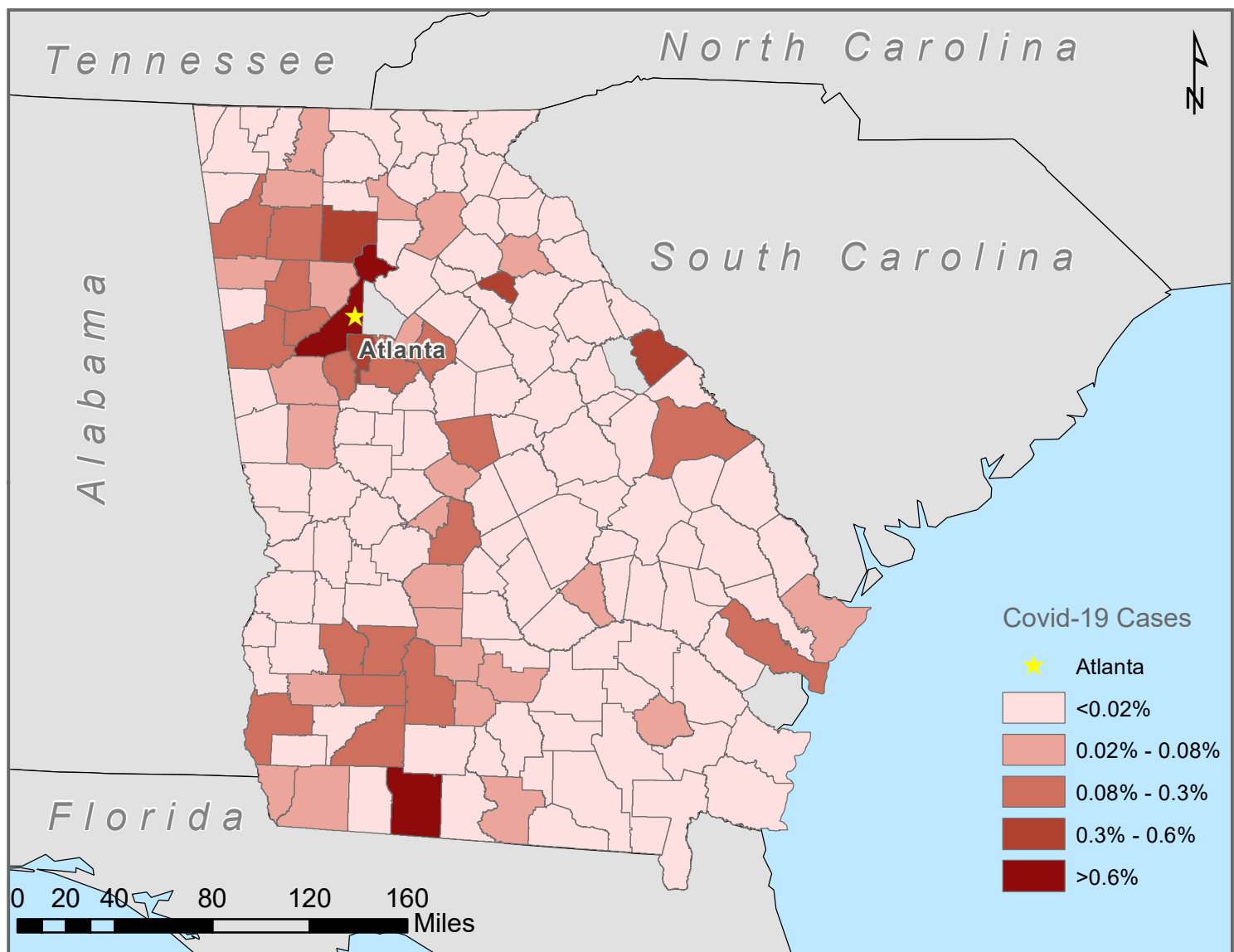
Utah Ski Resorts

Covid-19 in Georgia



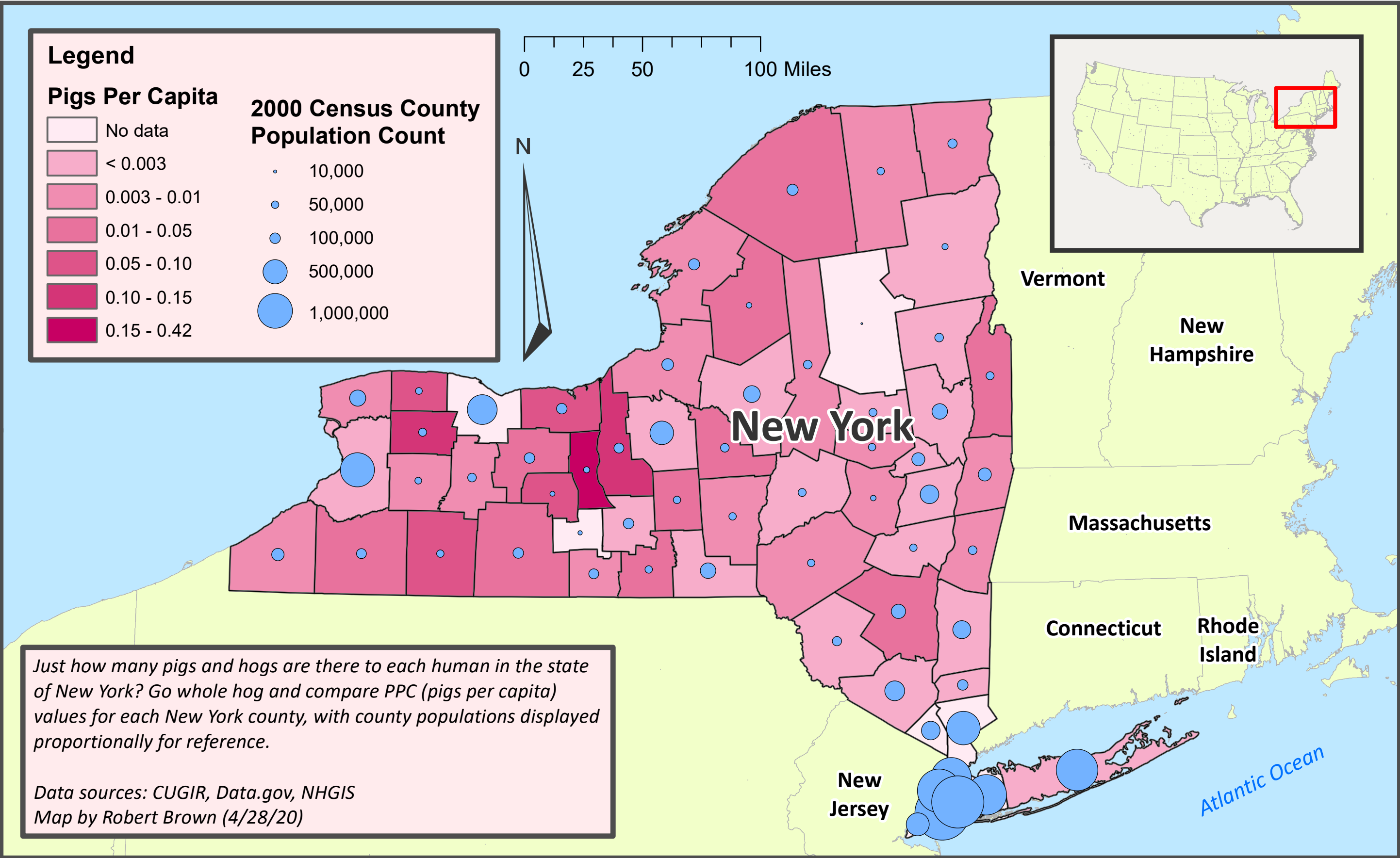

It reached the state of Georgia in March, 2020 and has since spread to almost every county throughout the state. This map shows the cases of Covid-19 in each county, normalized by population. It is evident that the counties in and around the metro Atlanta area have been hit relatively hard, the first cases occurring in Fulton County, where Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport is located.



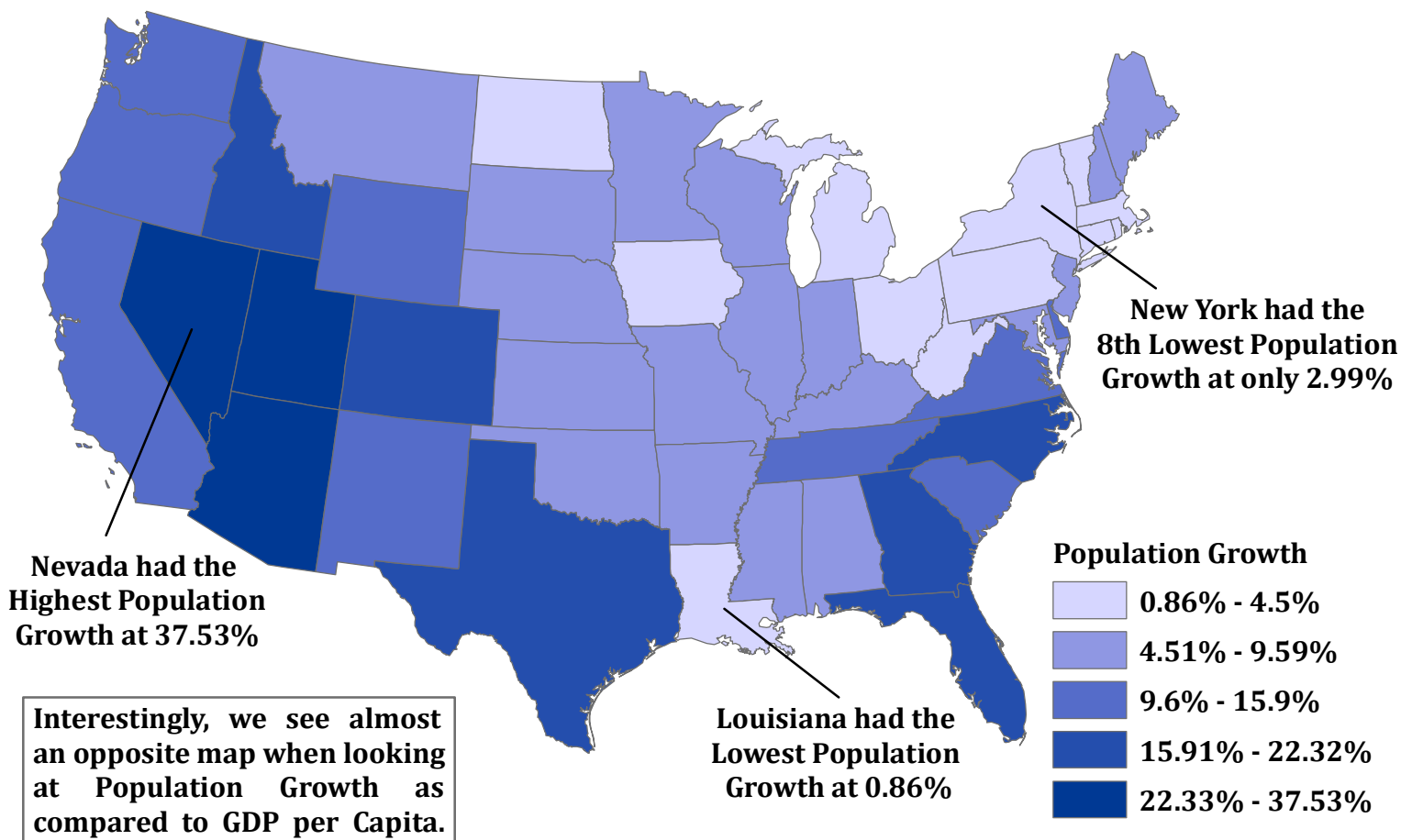
Covid-19 is highly contagious, and CDC advises several practices to protect yourself from contracting the virus and to prevent the spread.

5. Clean and disinfect household surfaces often.

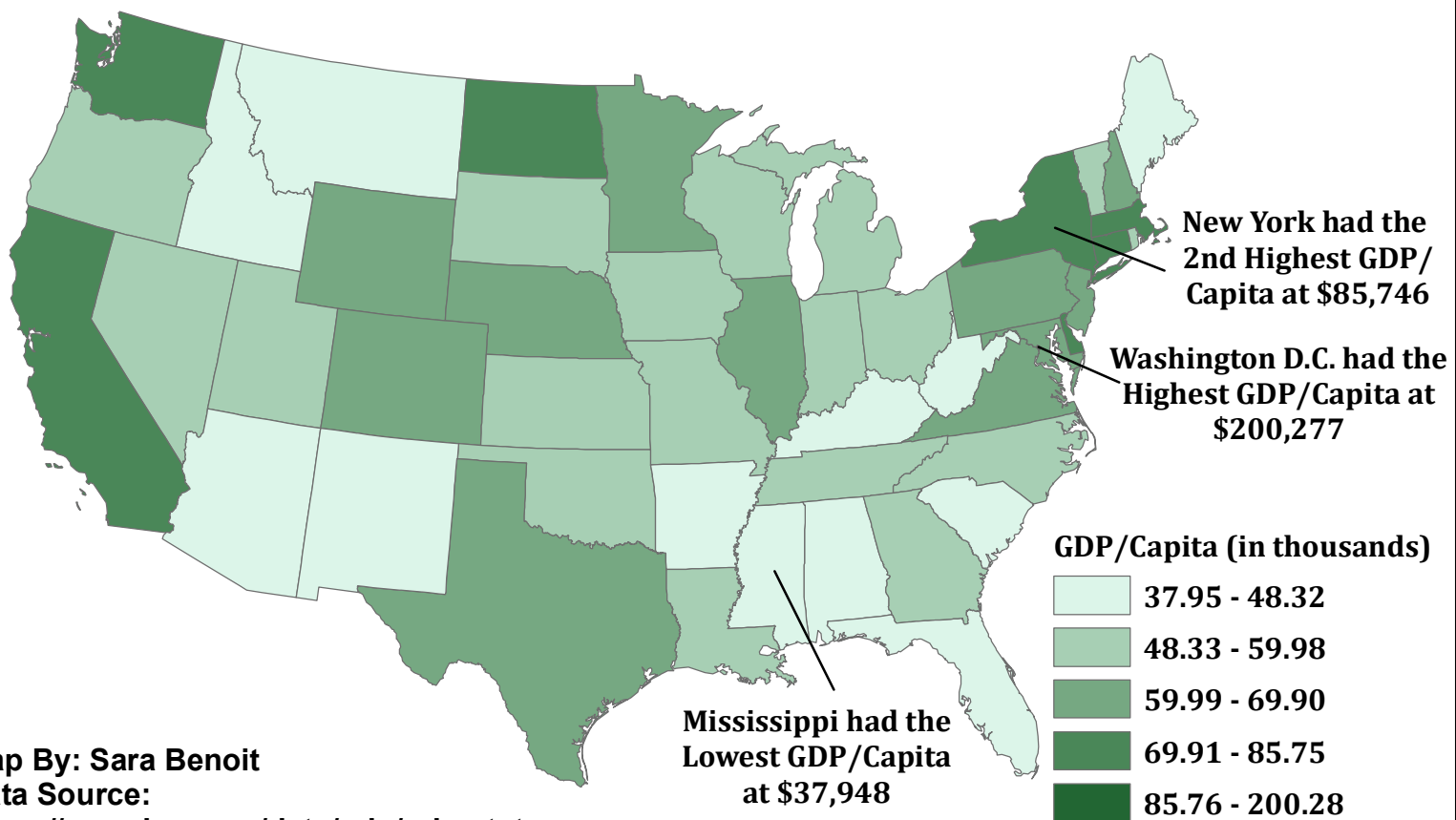
Pig Populations Per Capita in New York Counties

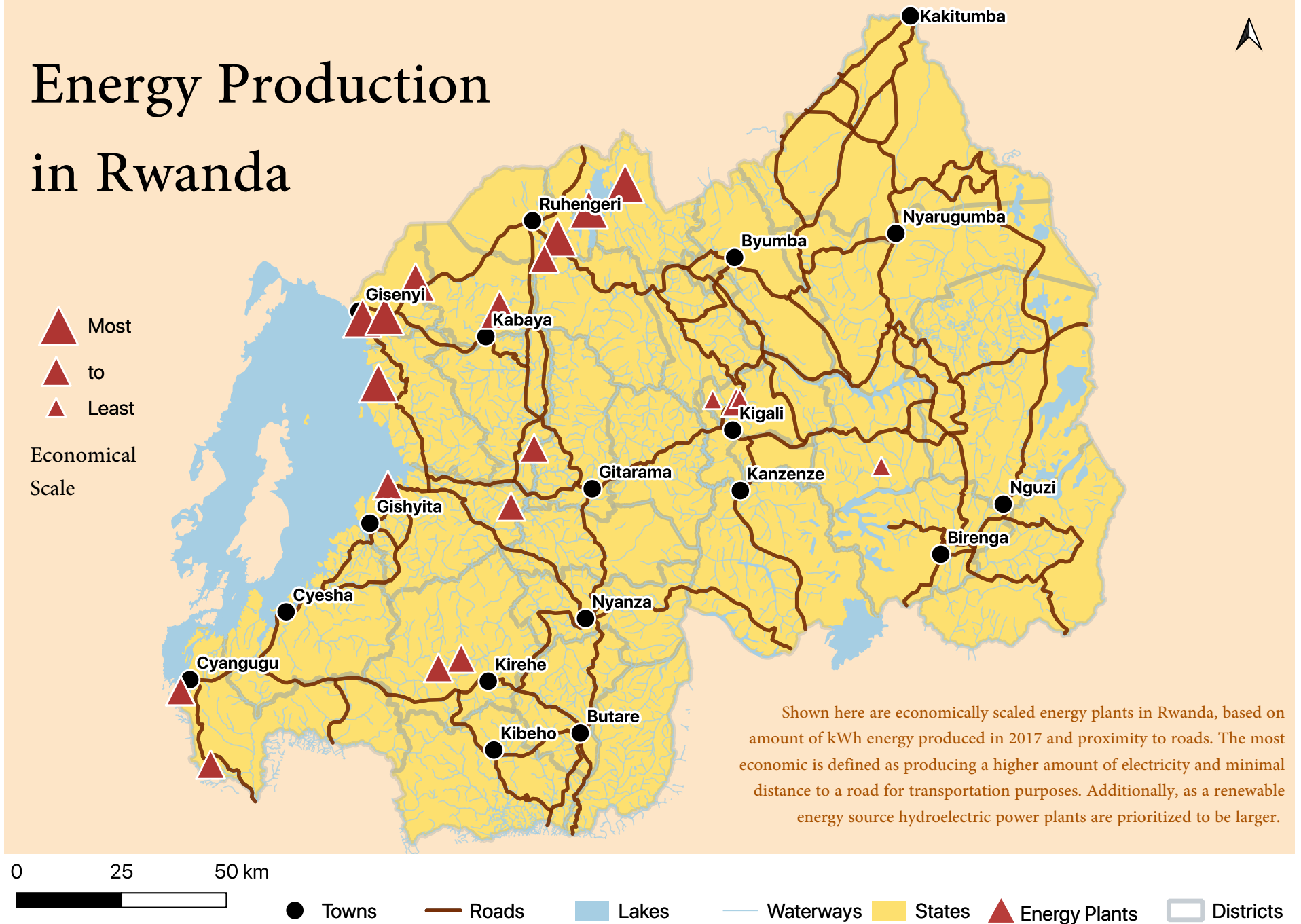

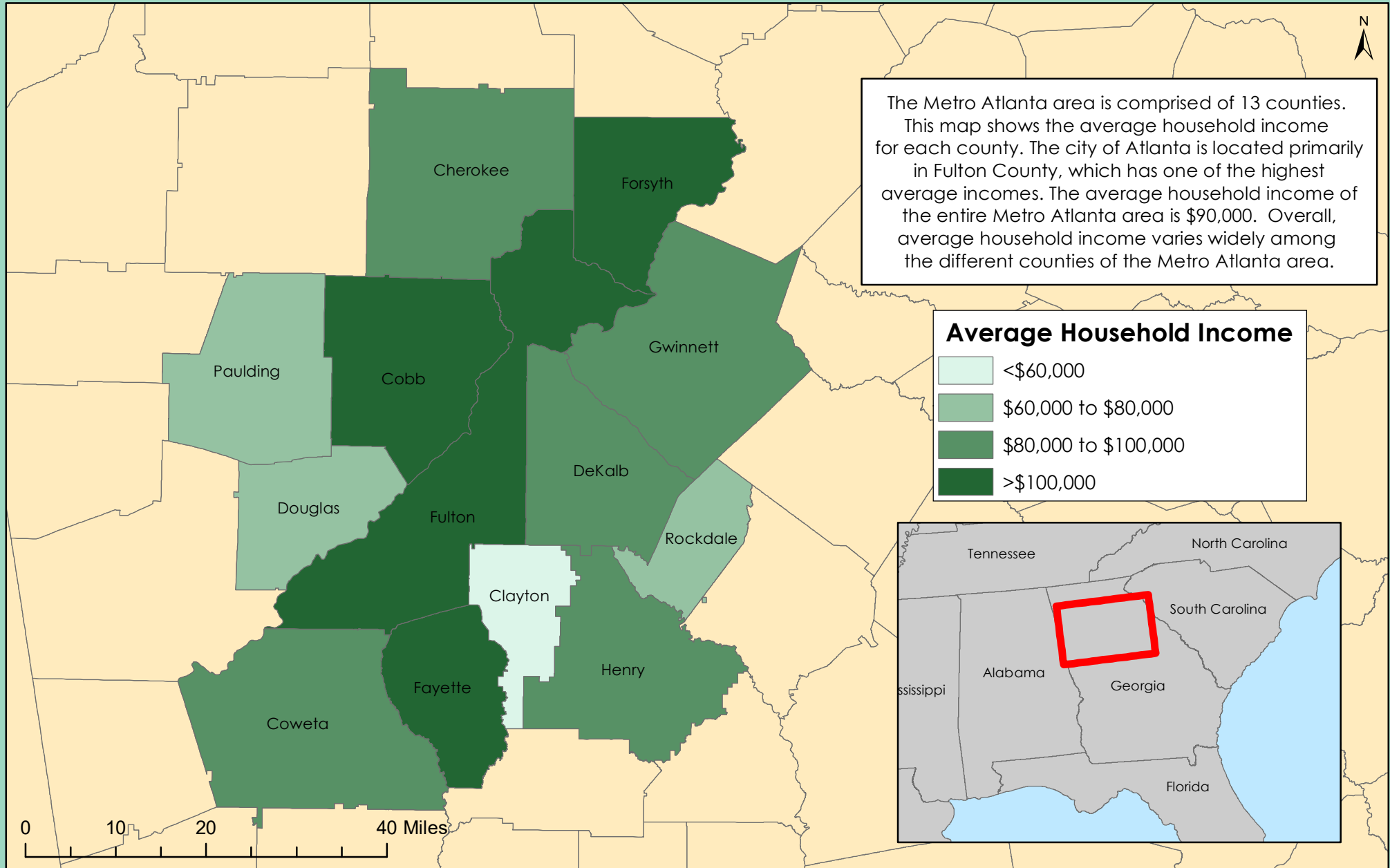

Immigration Across the Globe 2015-2020

This is a map of countries classified by net migration rate. Migration rate is the difference between the number of persons entering and leaving a country during the year, per 1,000 persons. This number indicates the contribution of migration to the overall level of population change. The net migration rate does not distinguish between economic migrants, refugees, and other types of migrants nor does it distinguish between lawful migrants and unlawful migrants. Three countries' migration rates stood out and are explained in more detail near each of those countries.

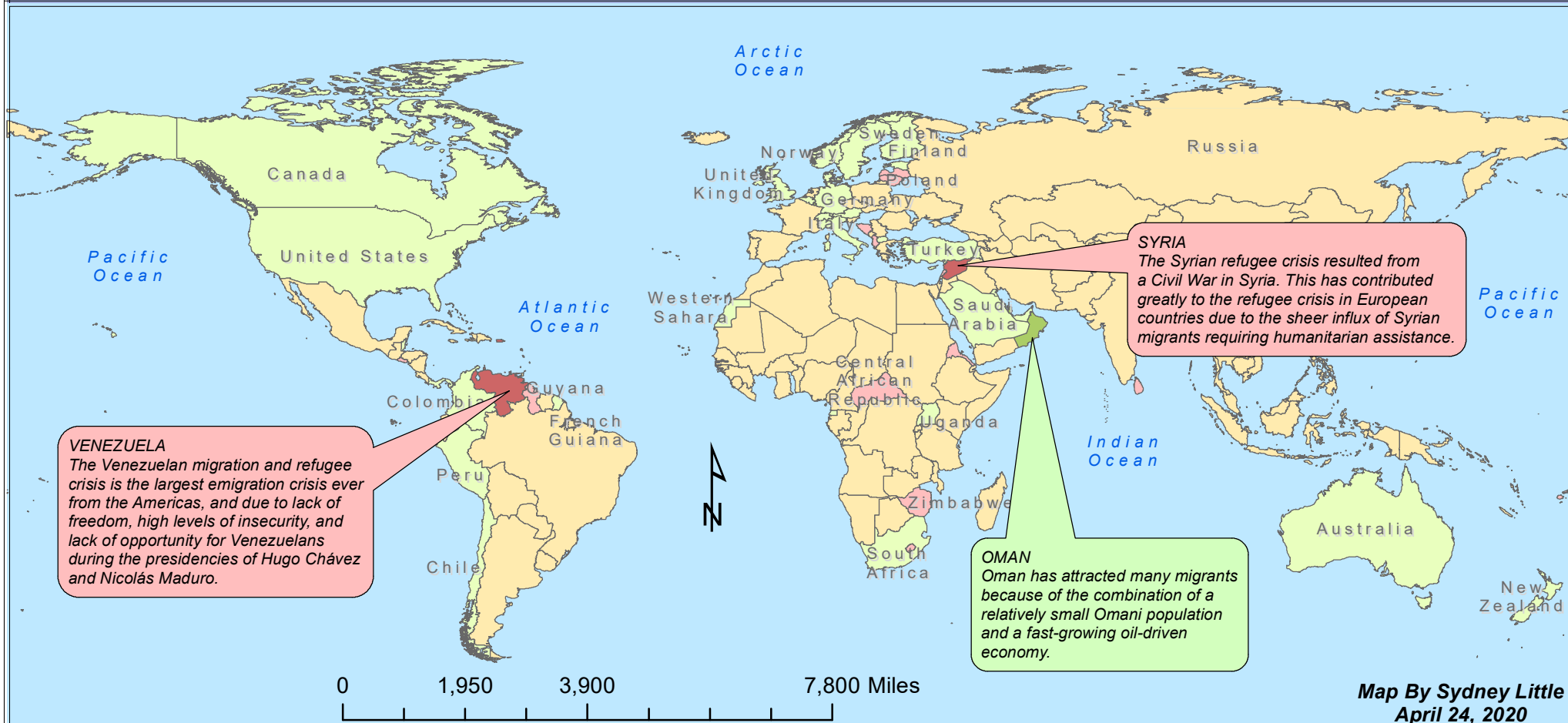

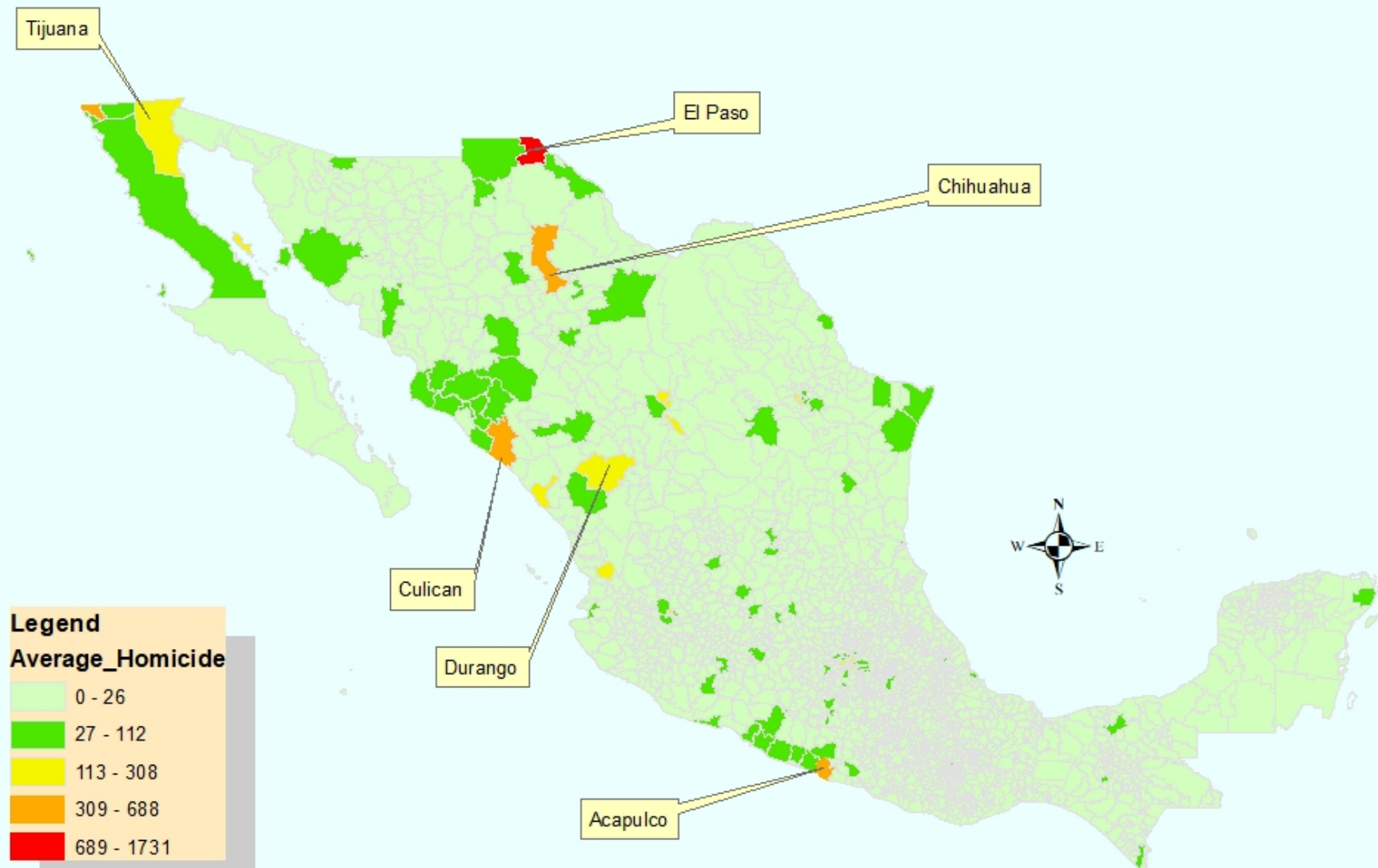

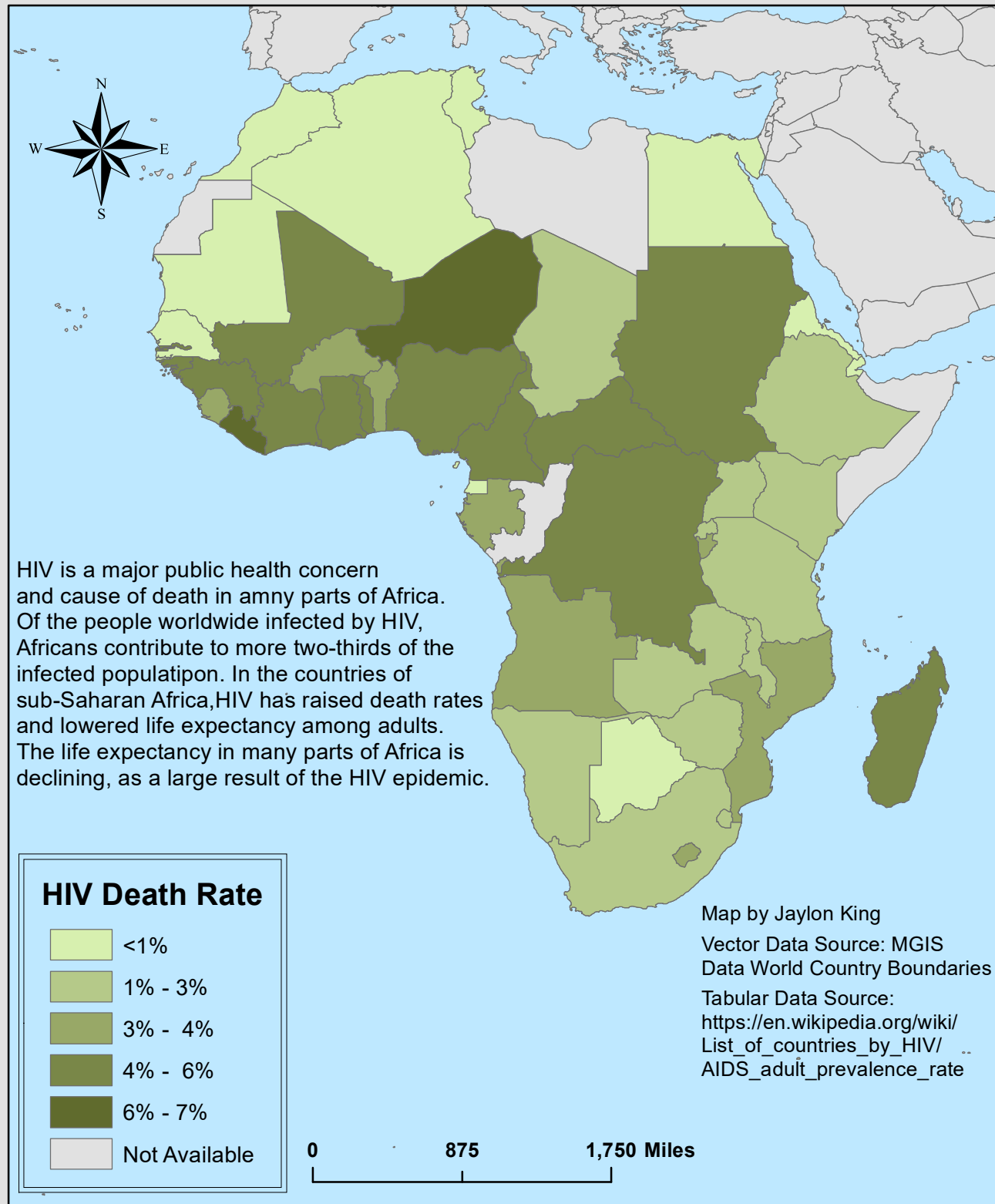
Does Happiness Rely on Money?

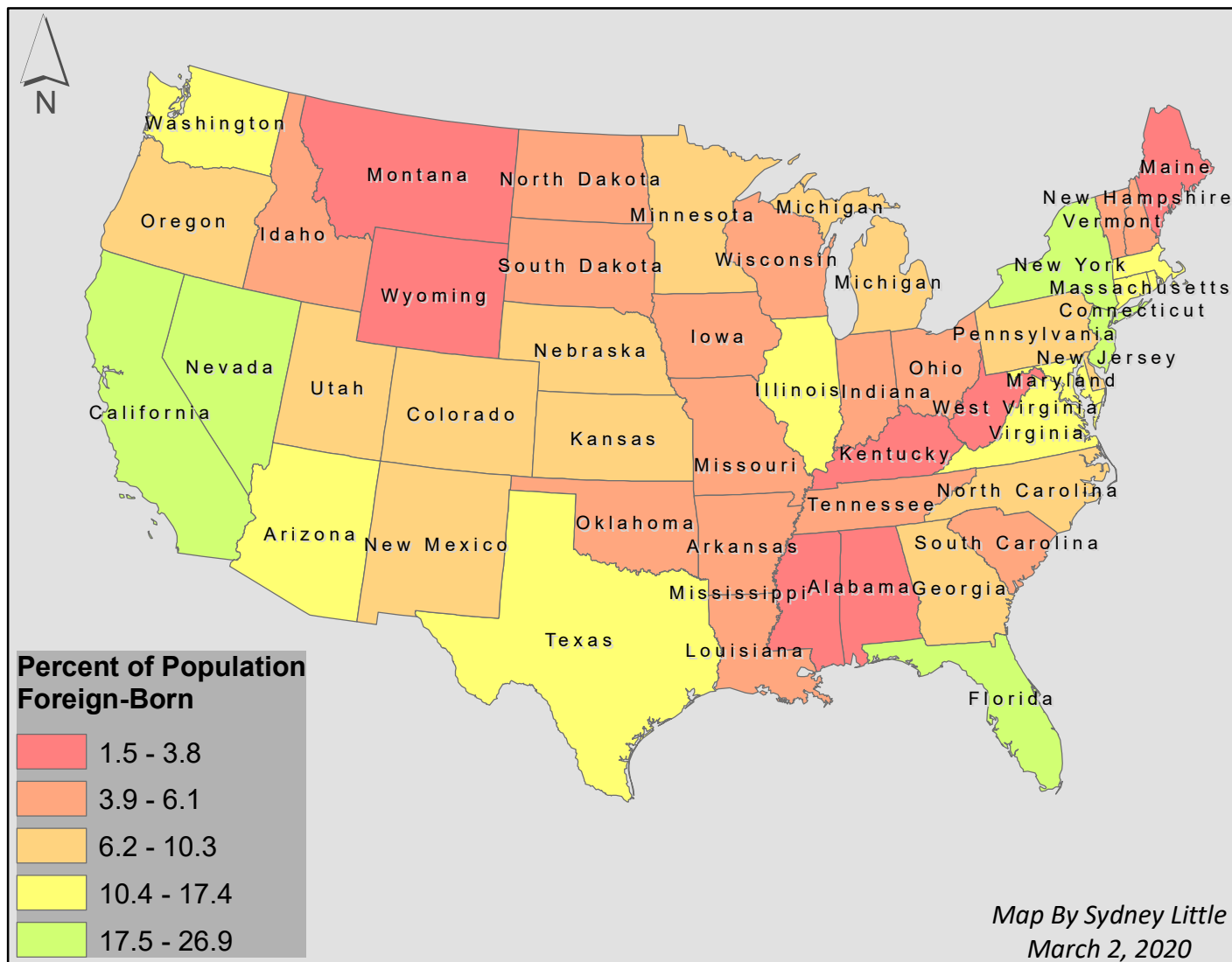
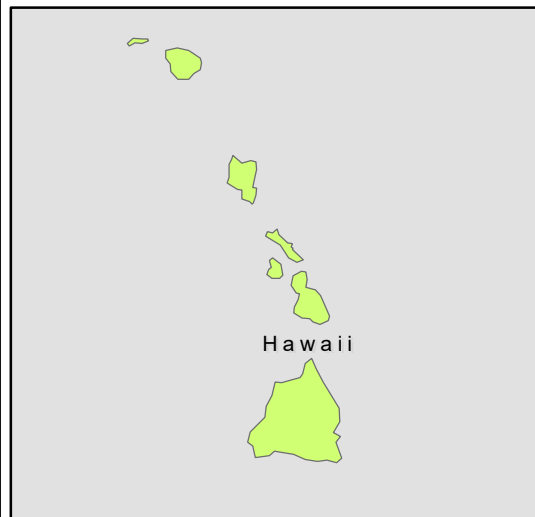
Percentage of Foreign-Born Population by U.S. State in 2018

13.7% of the national population is foreign-born.

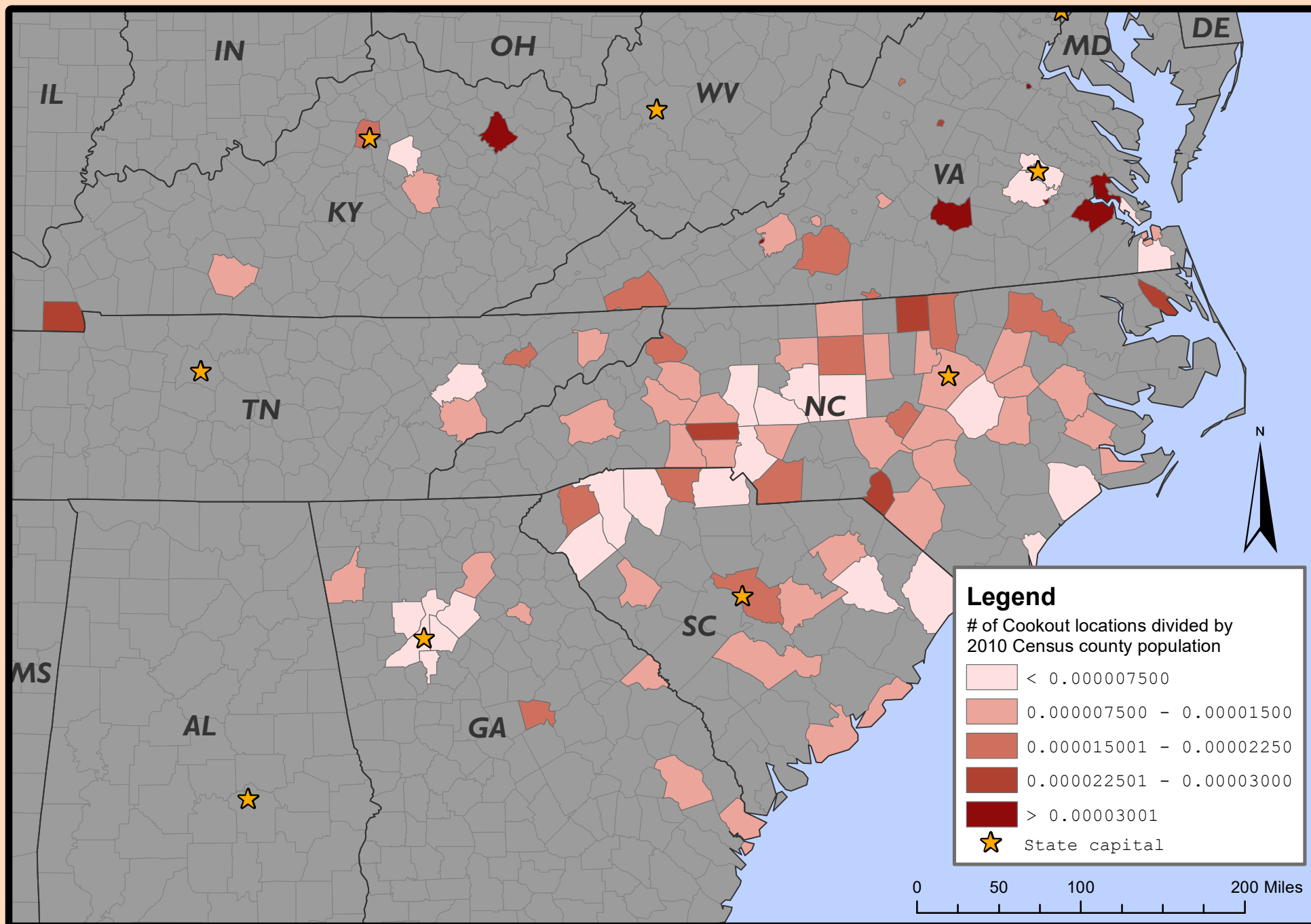

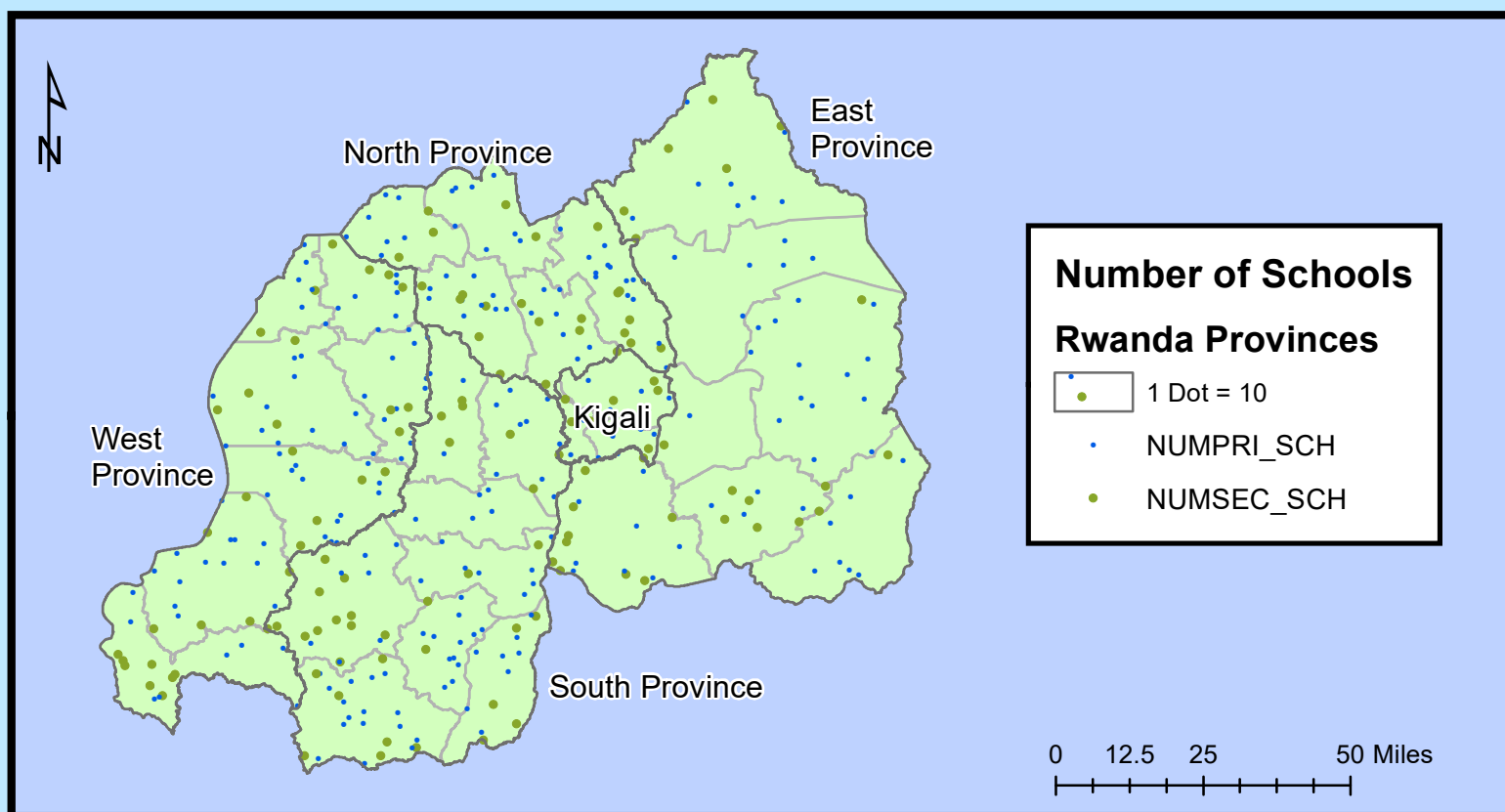

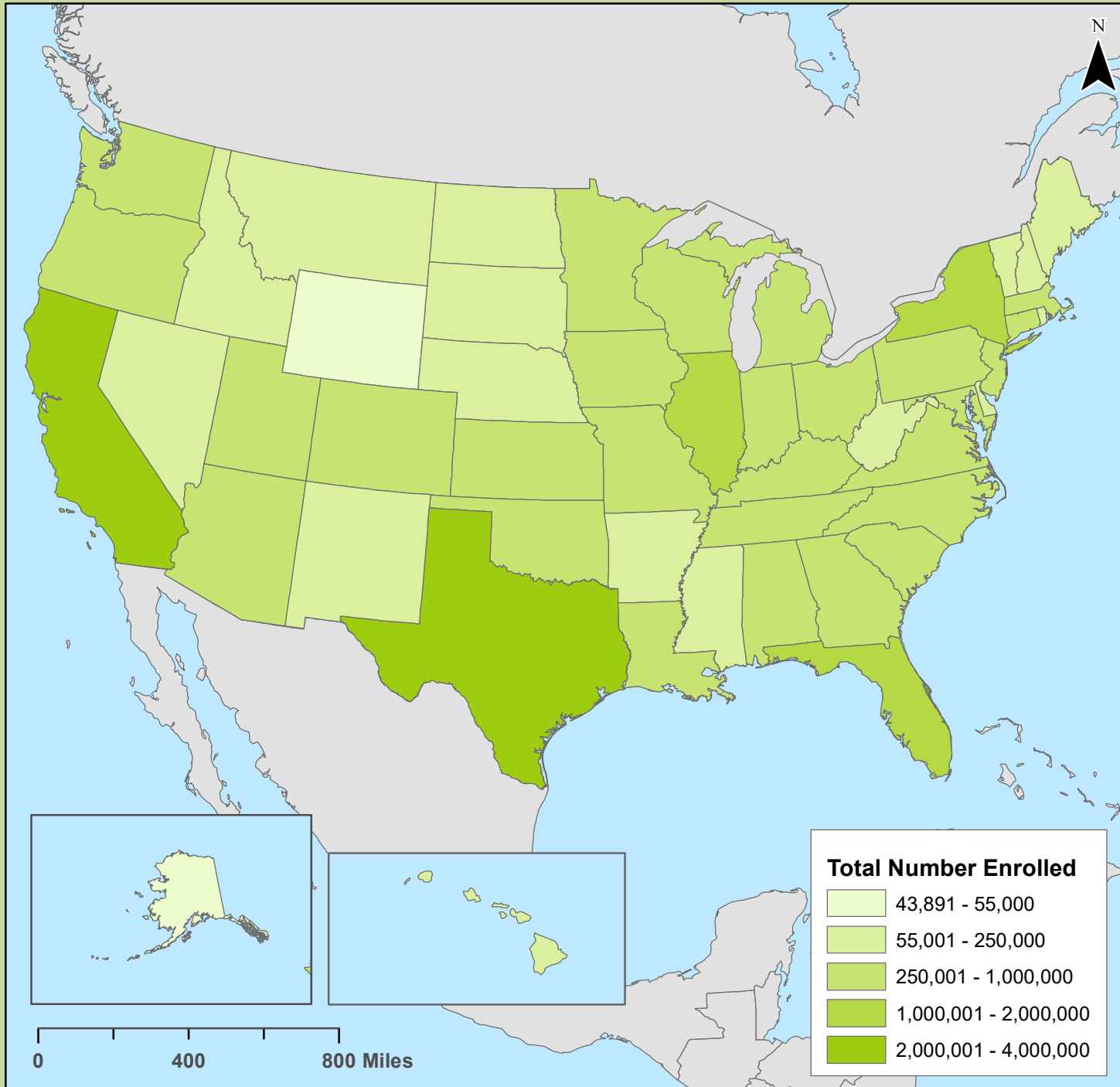
Education in Rwanda 2010

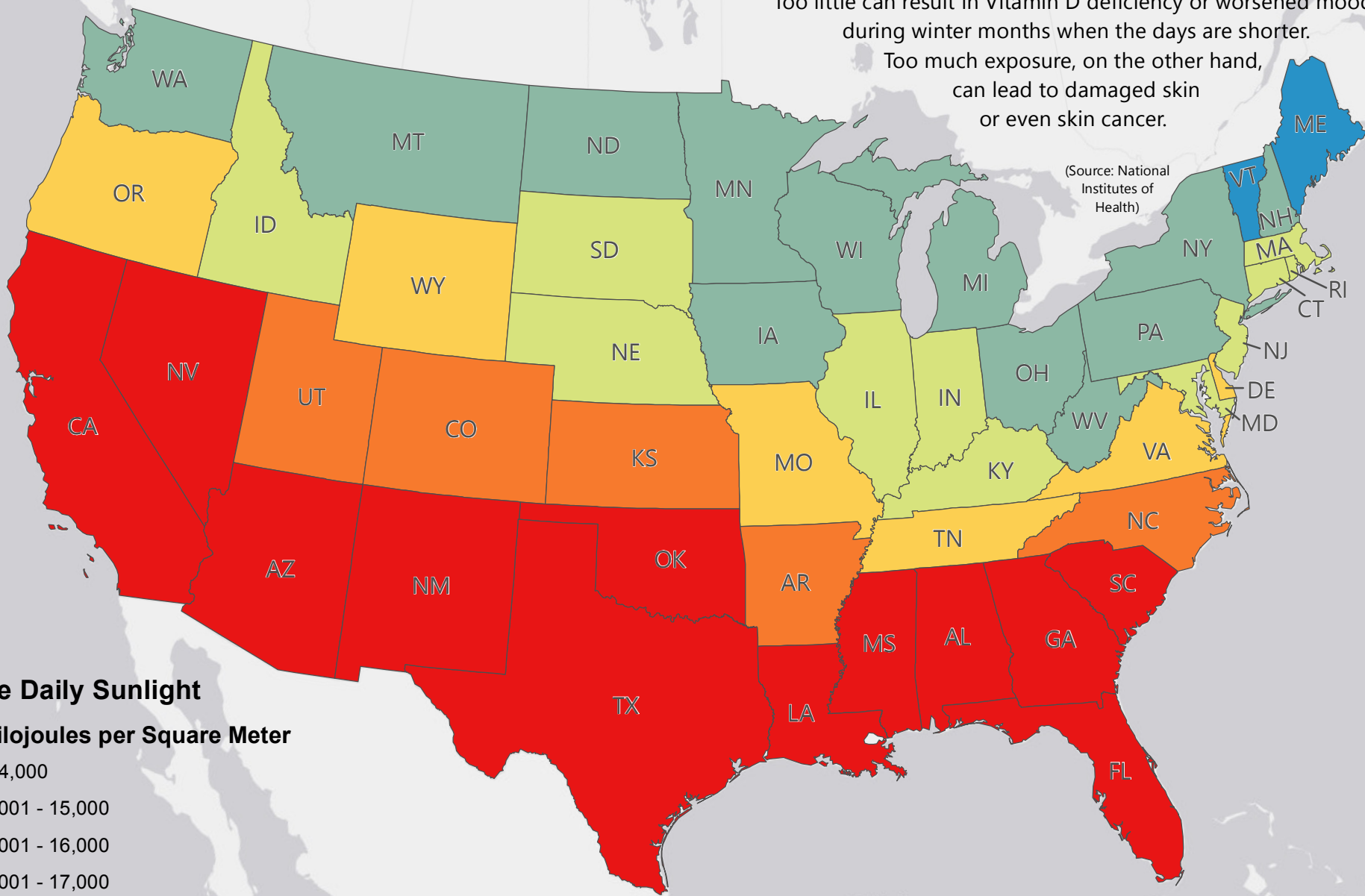

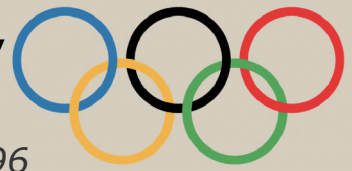

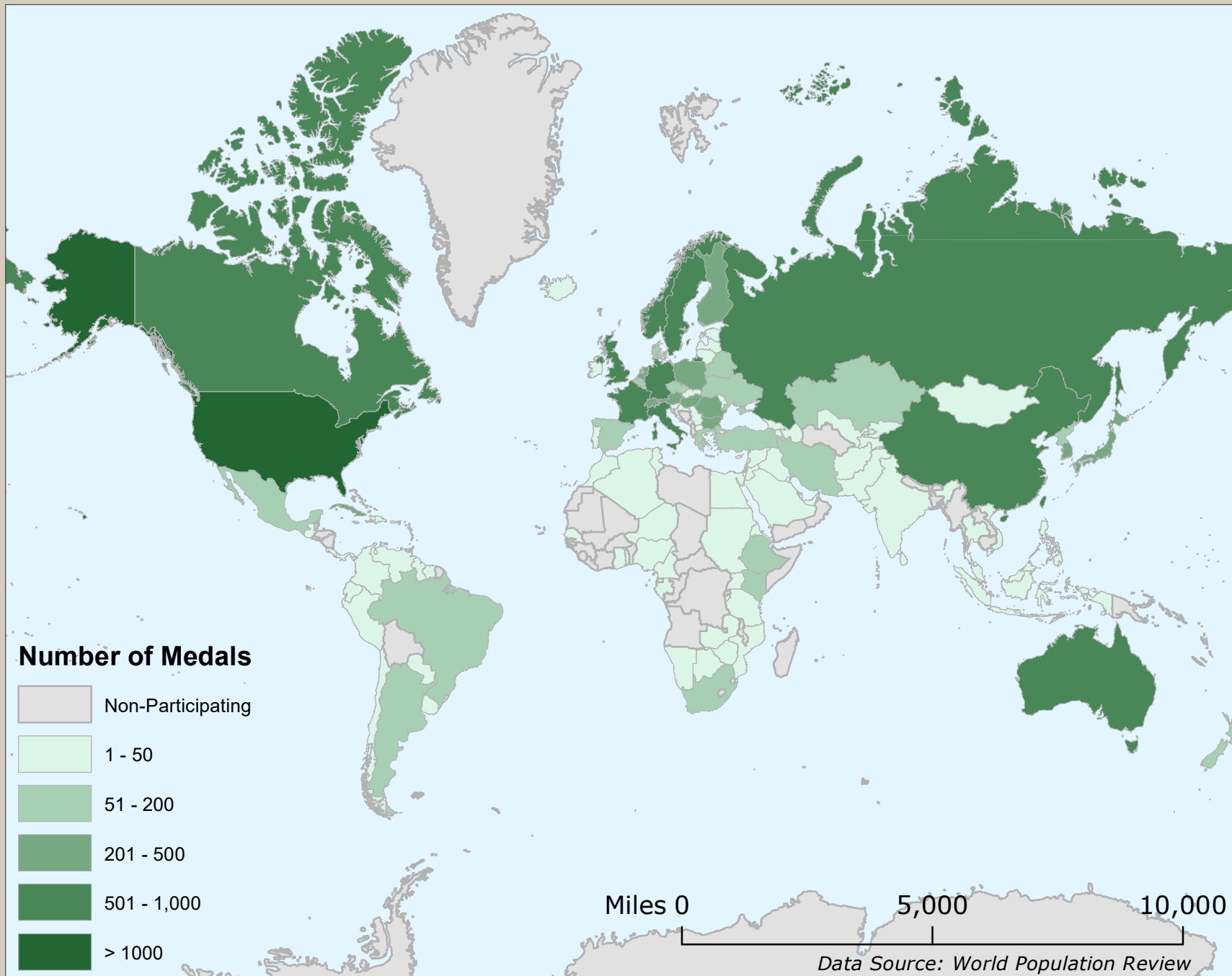

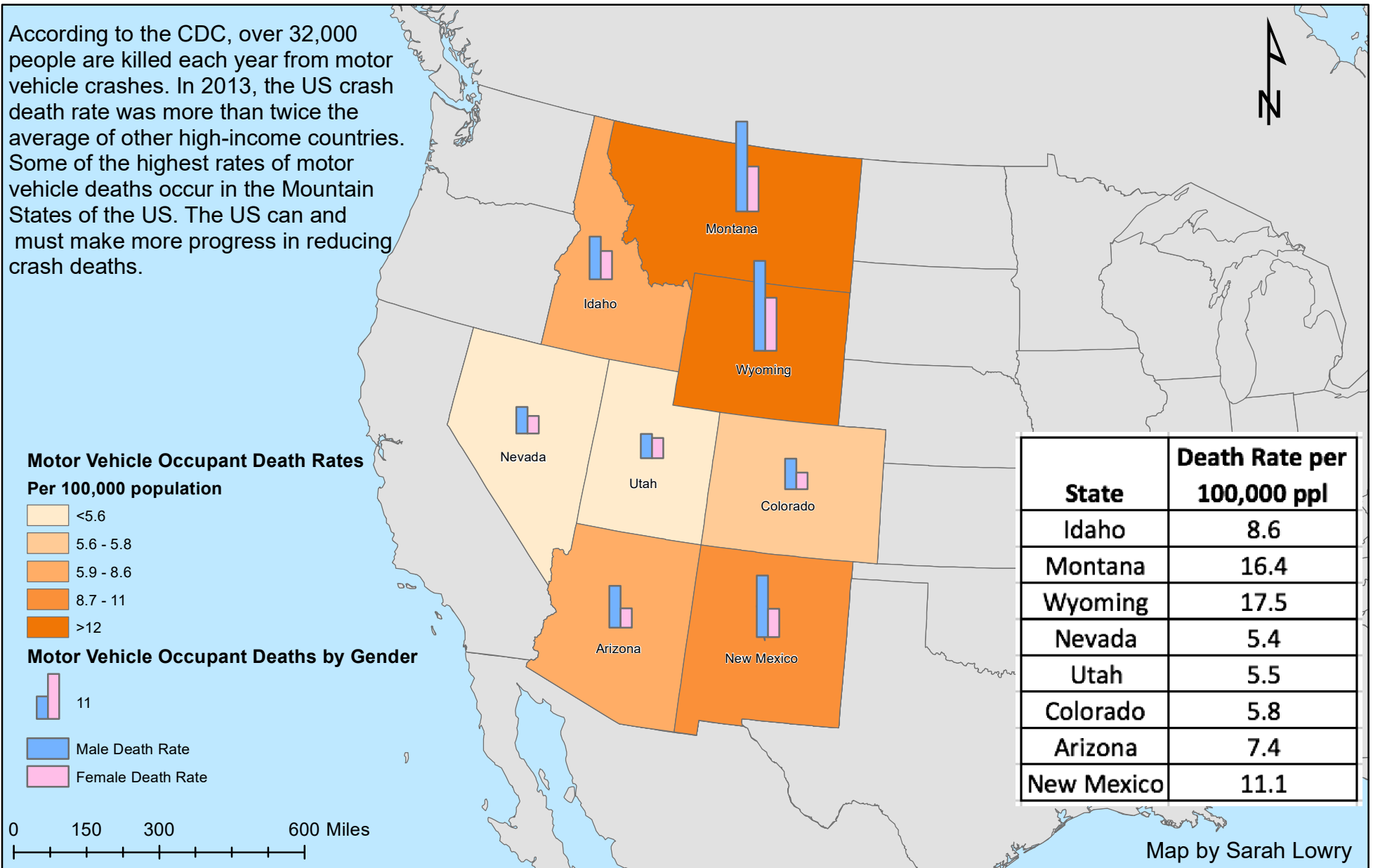

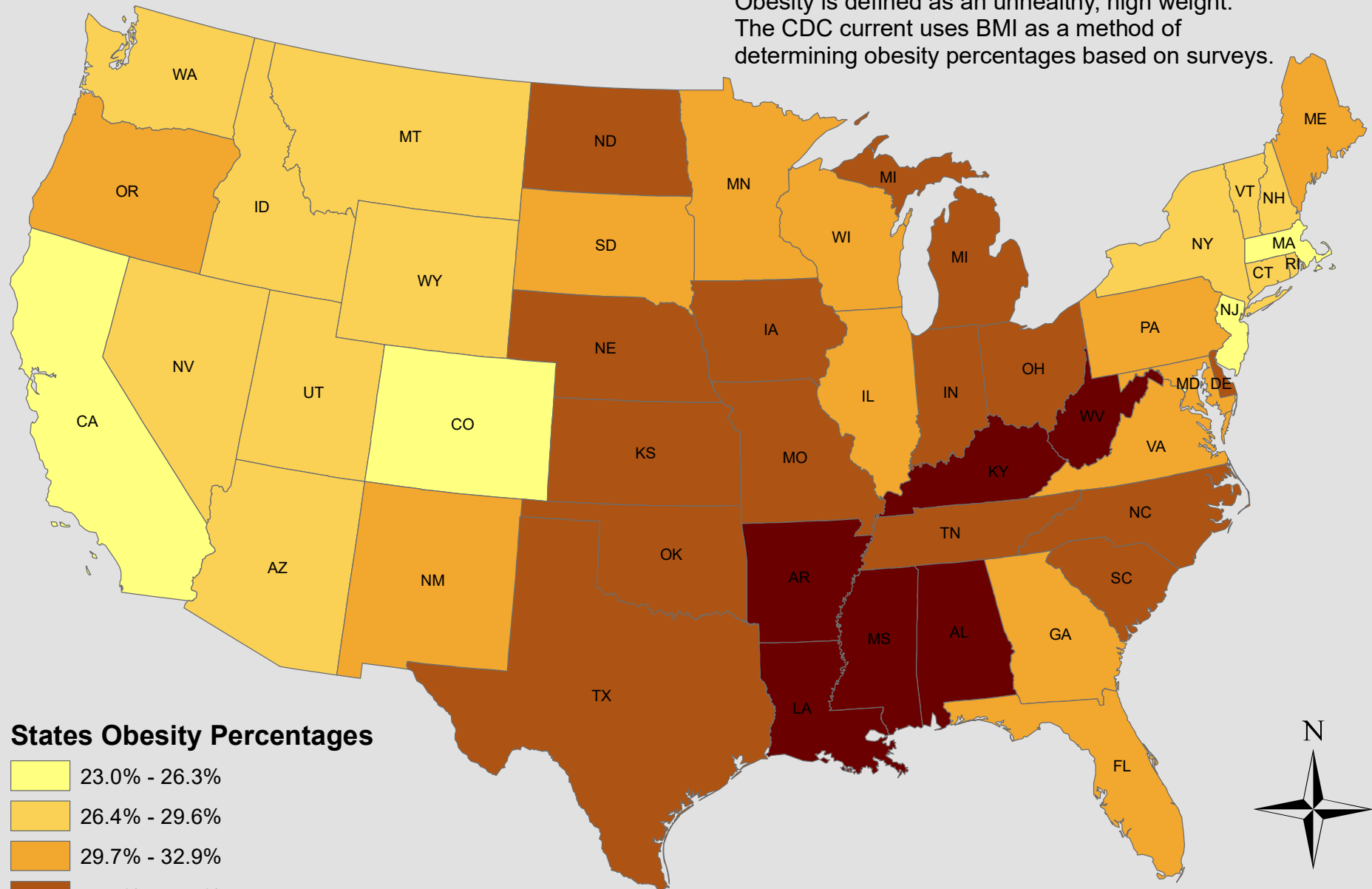

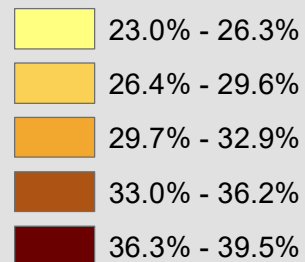

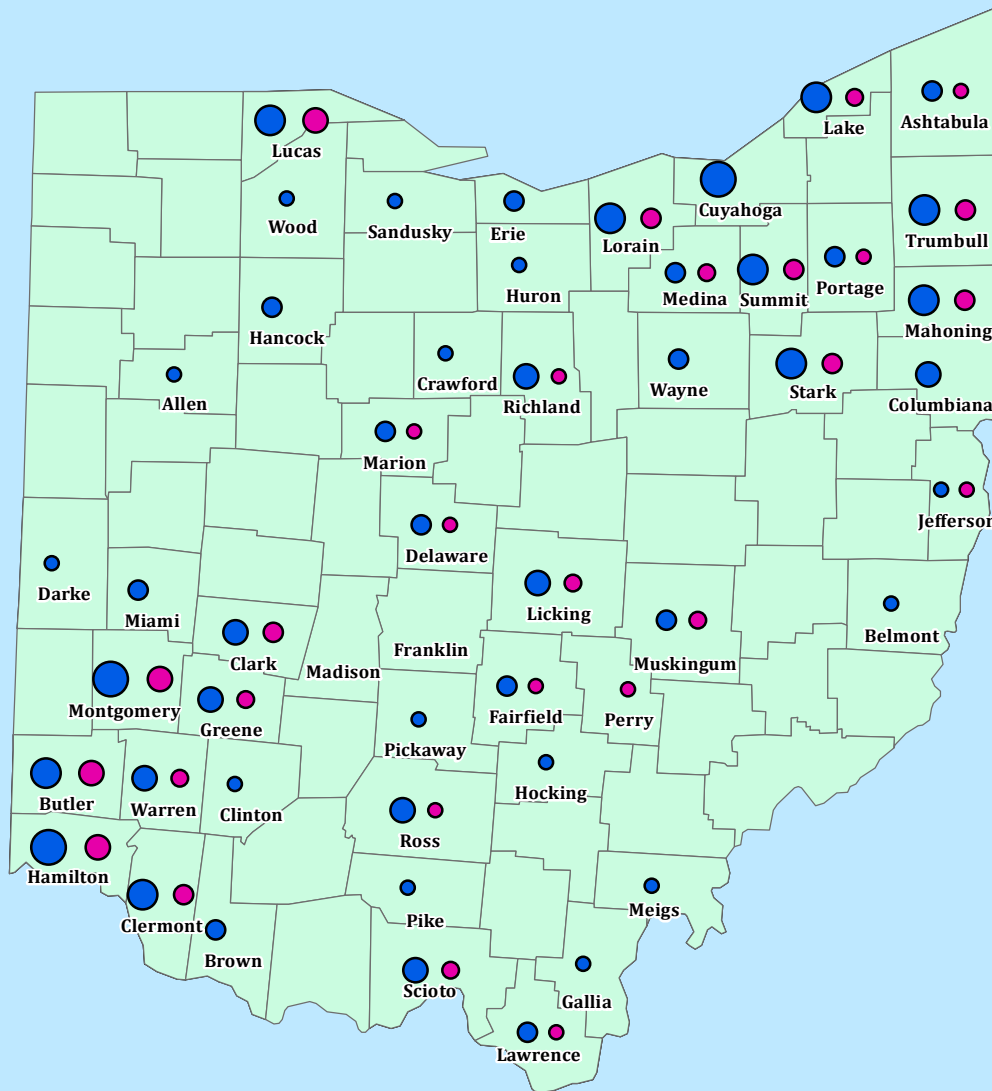

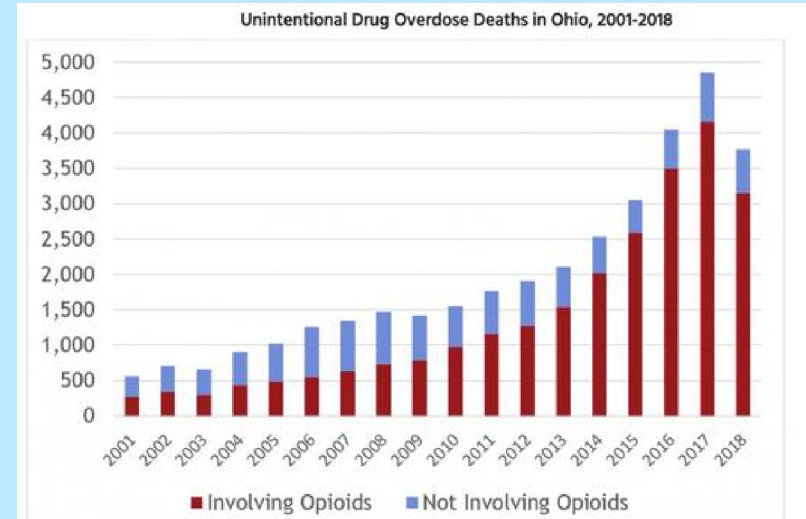

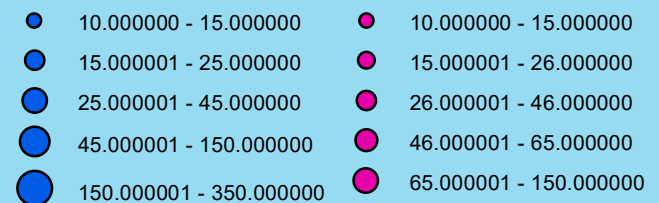
Ohio Drug Related Deaths by Gender

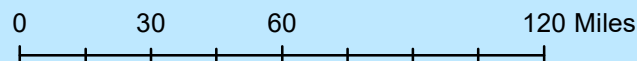


Count of Deaths Male v. Female

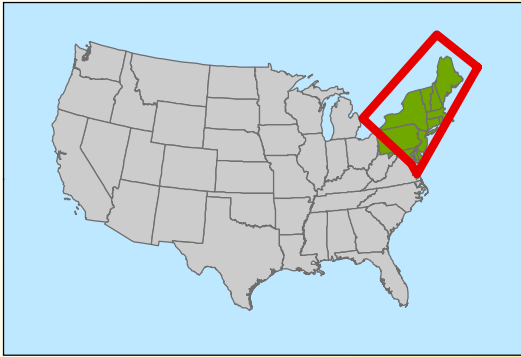

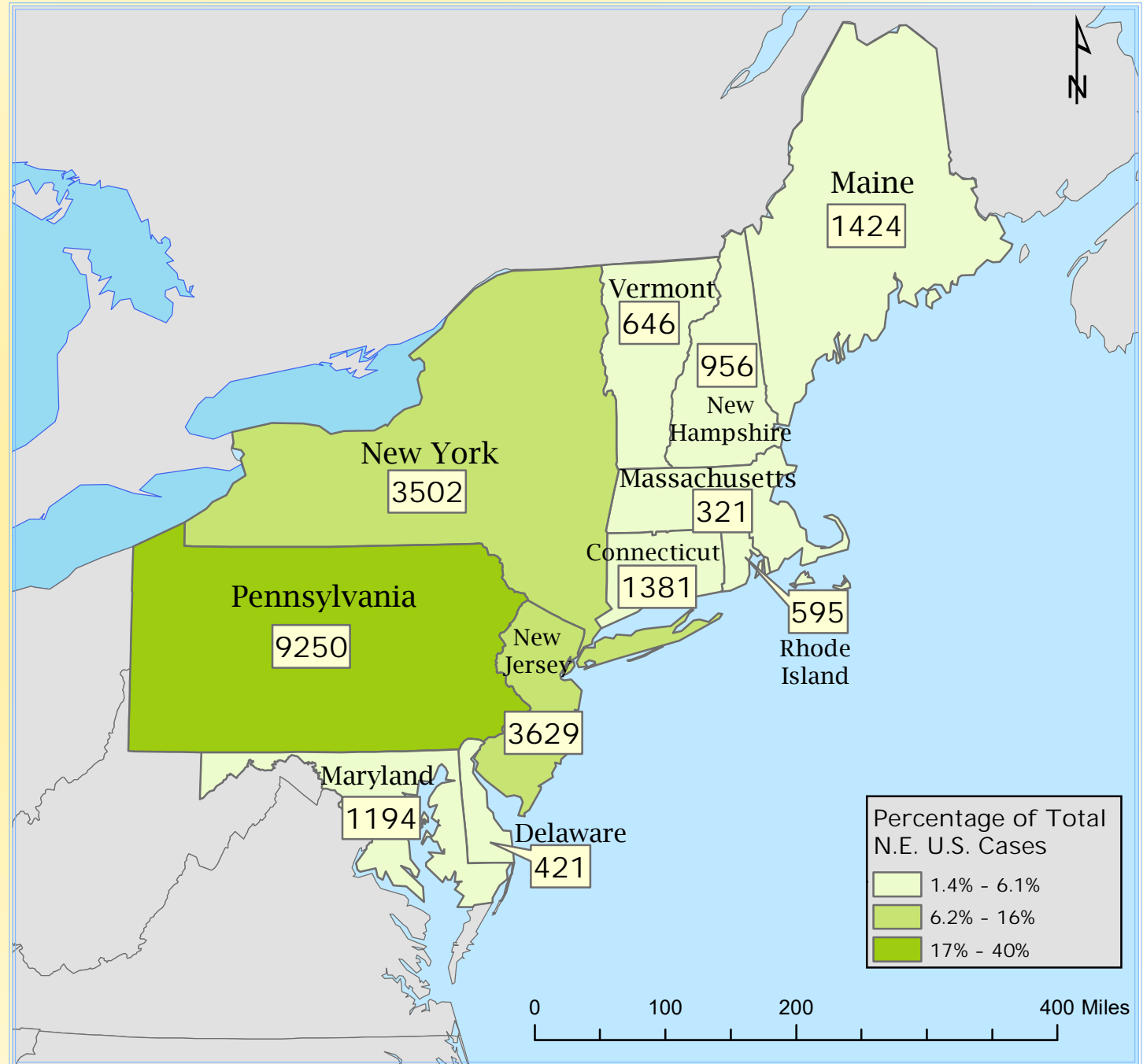
Lyme Disease Cases In the Northeastern United States

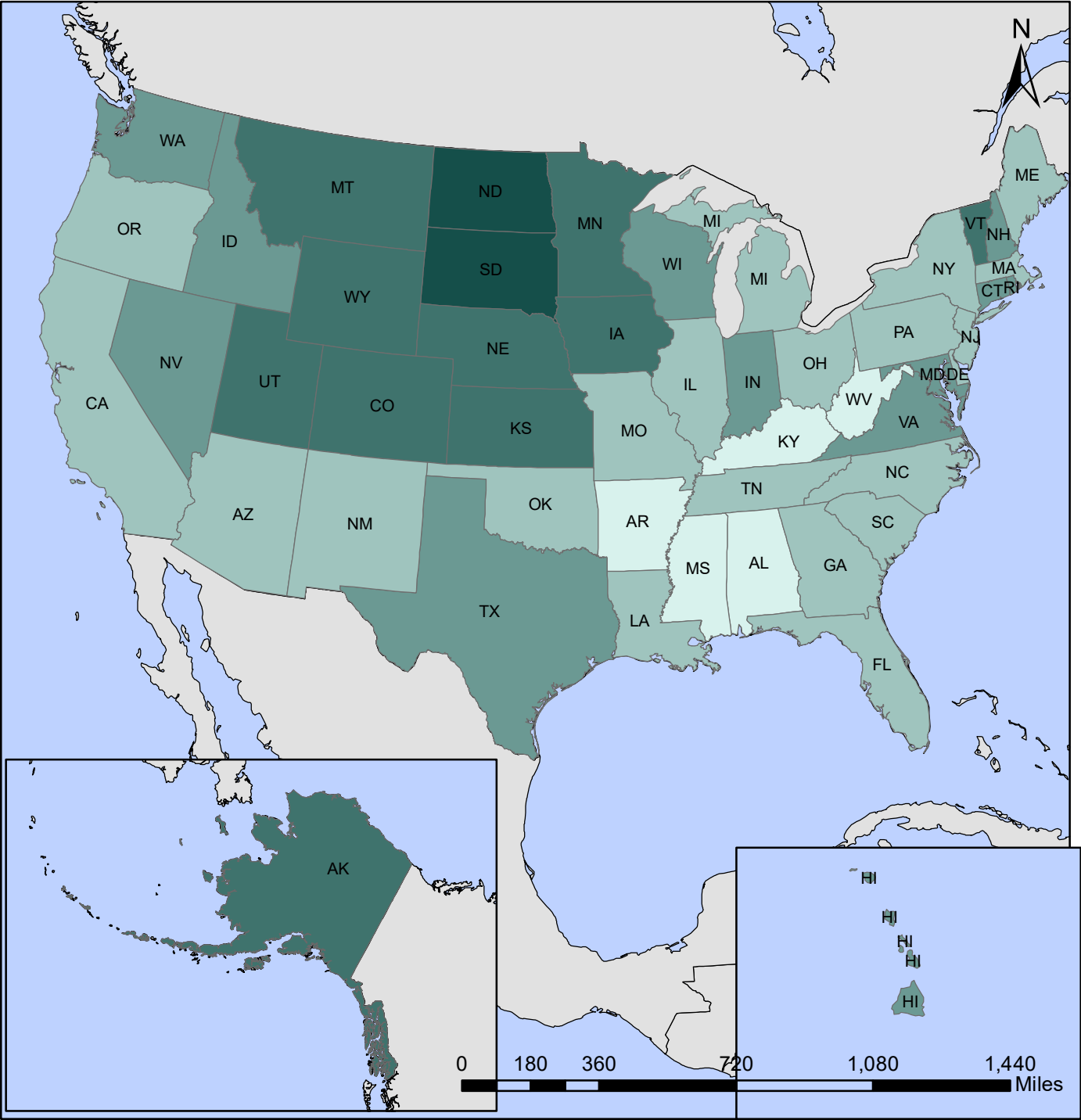

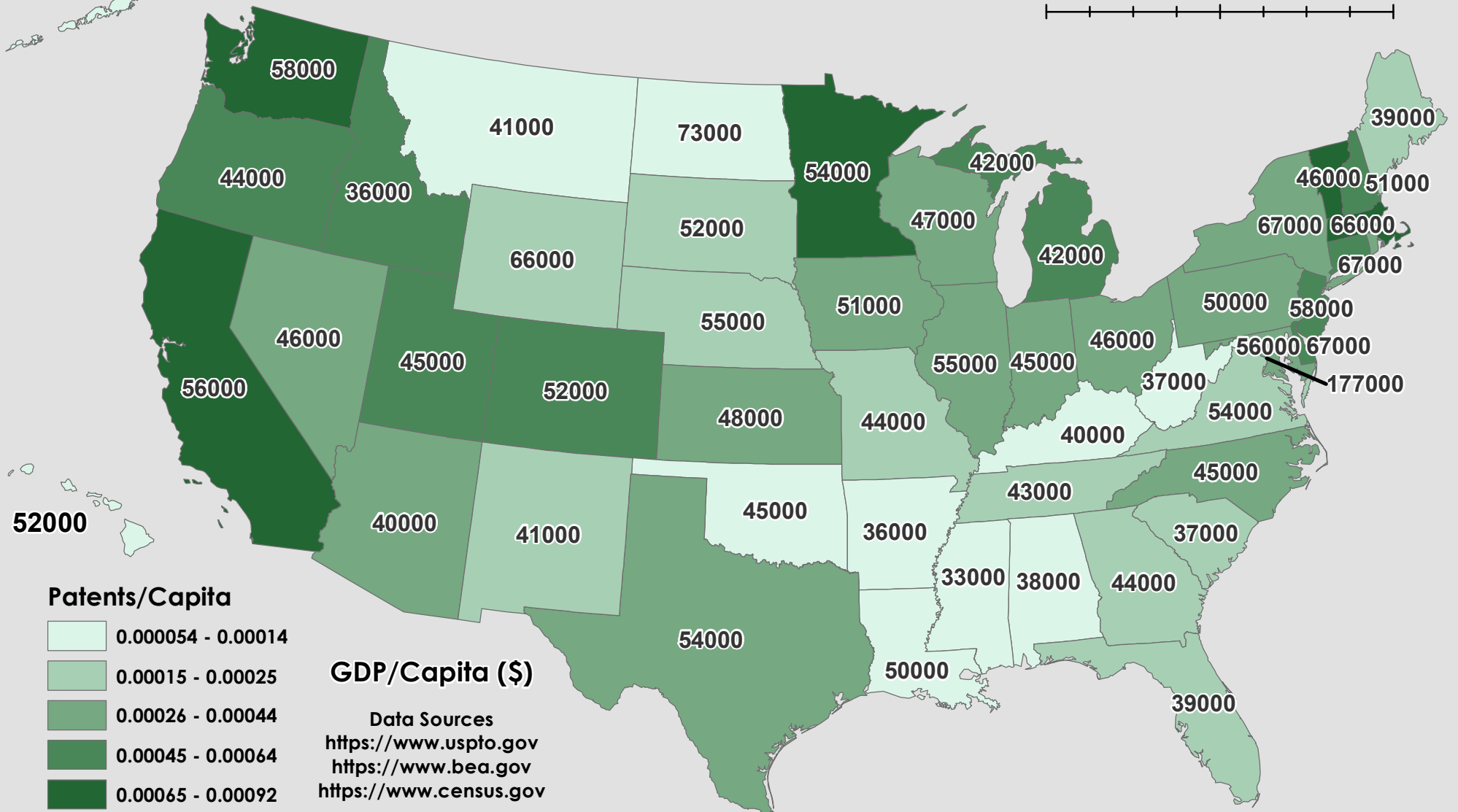

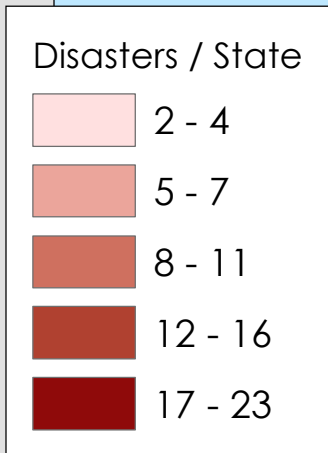

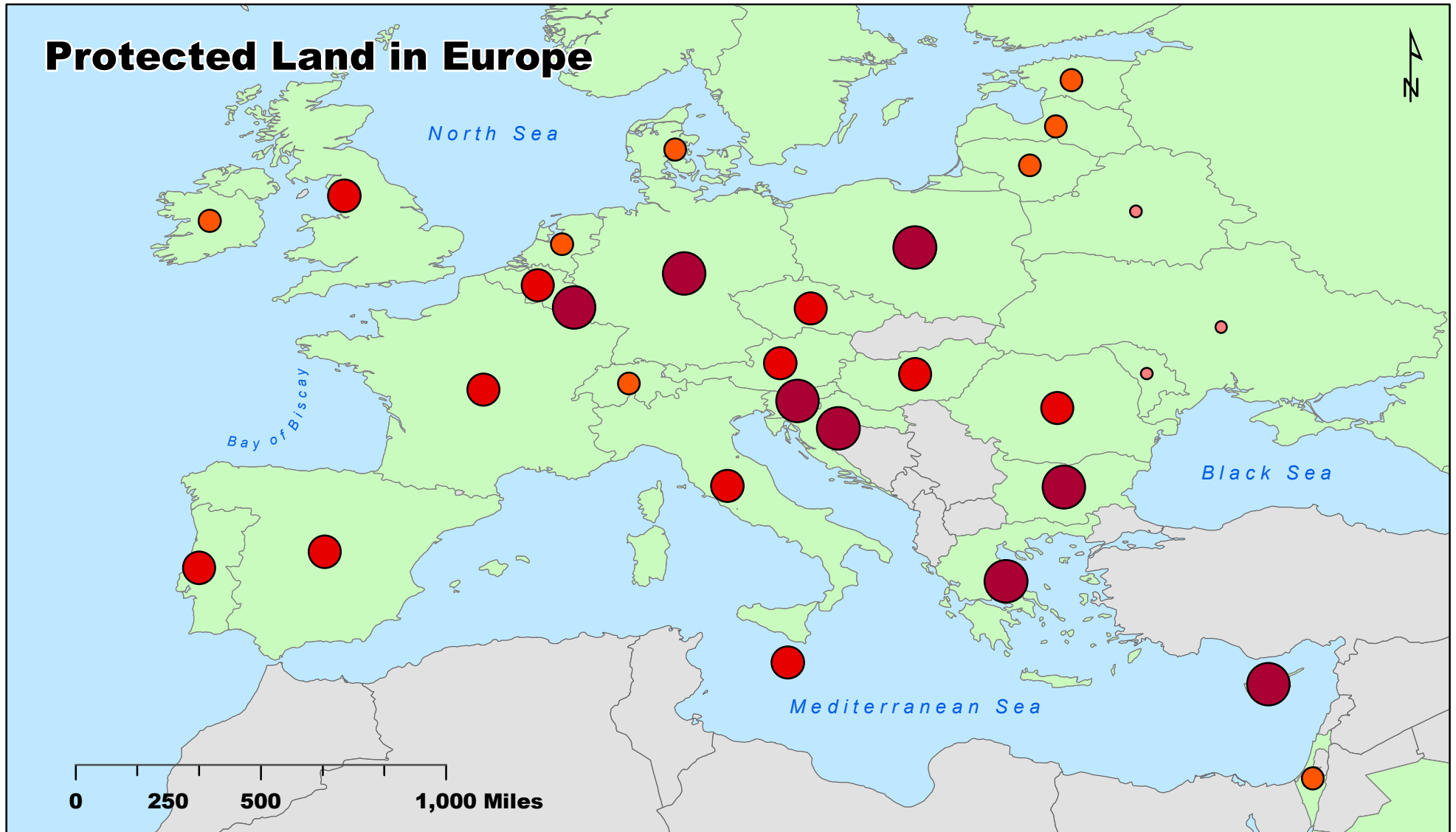

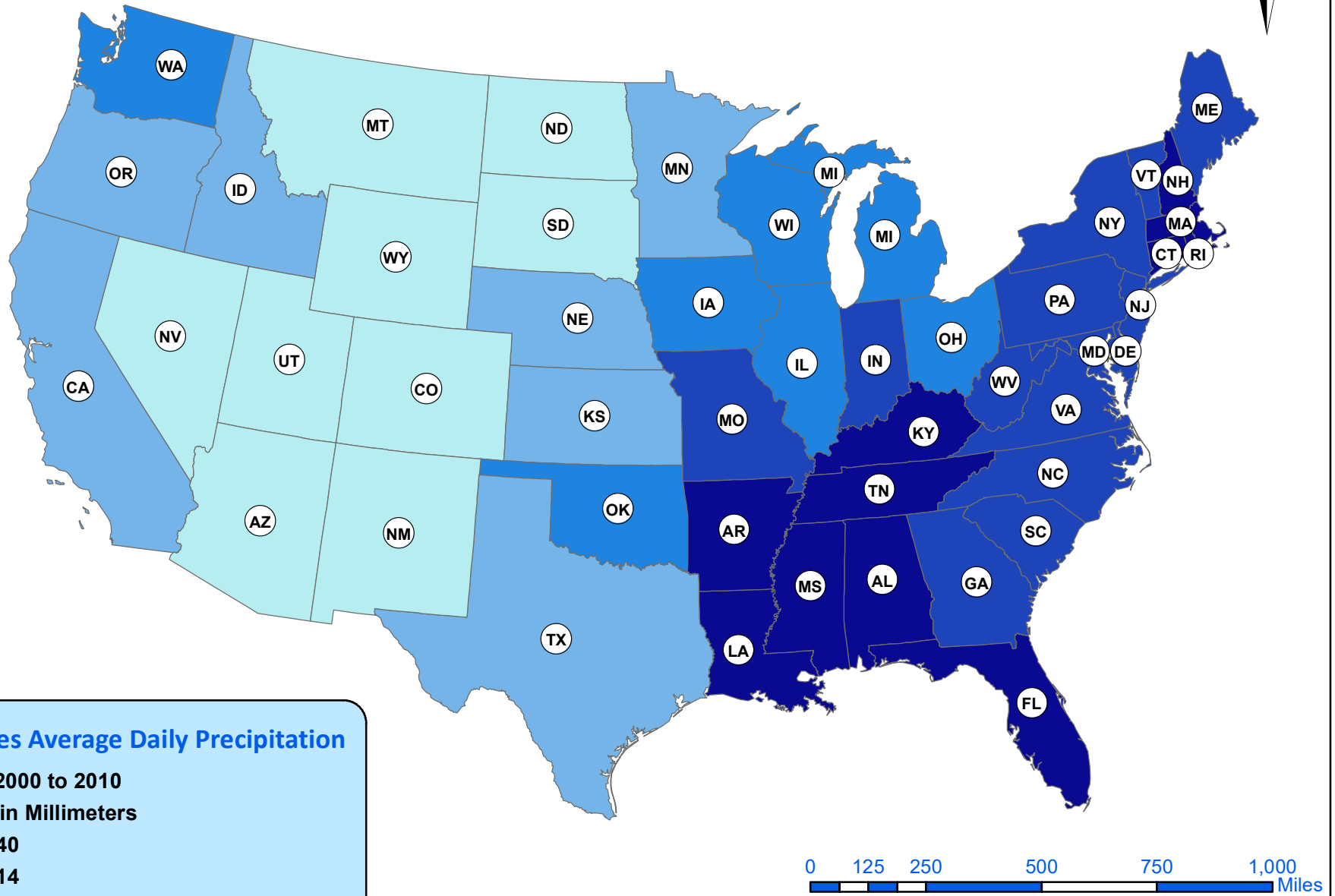

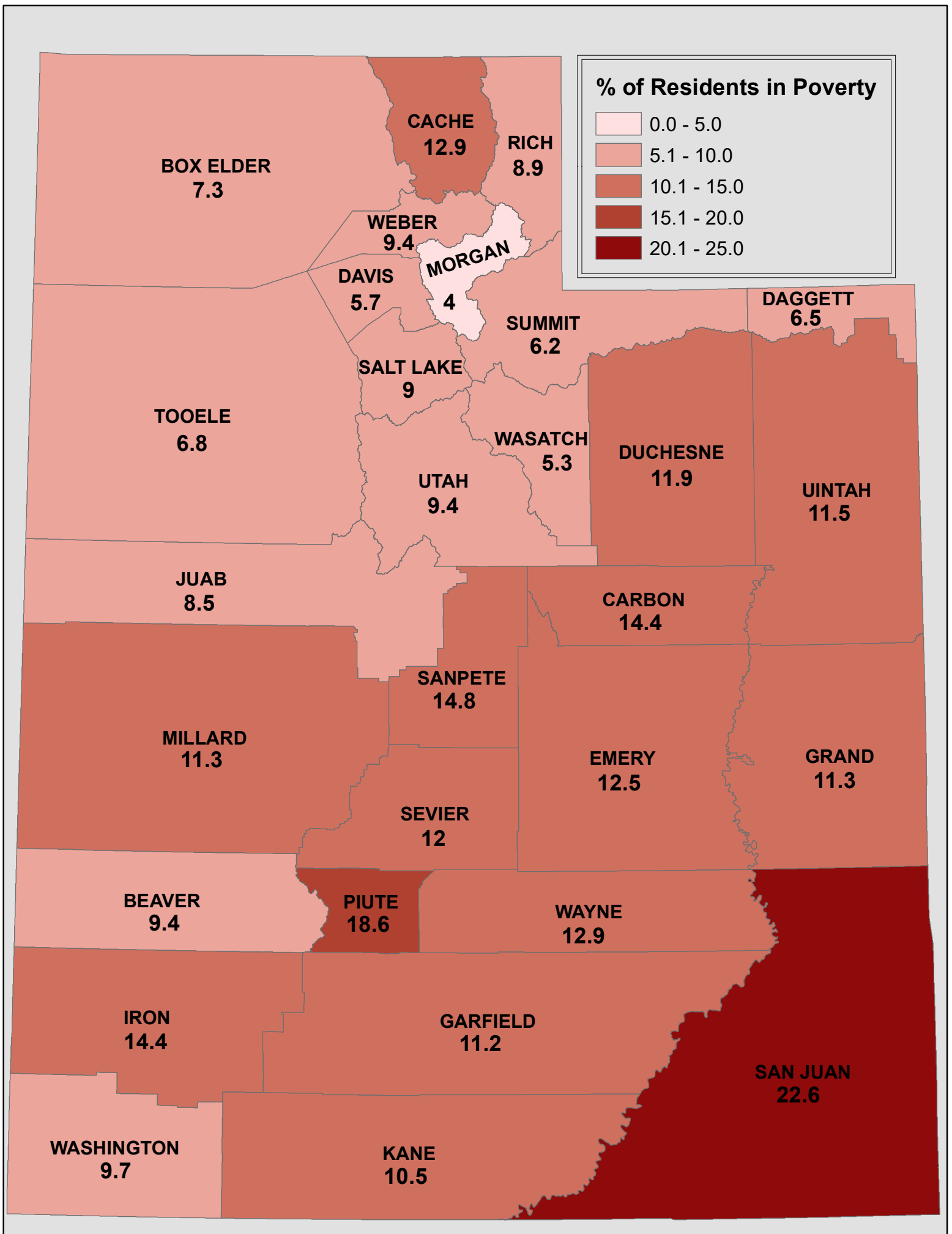
Average Daily Precipitation in the United States

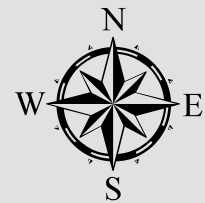
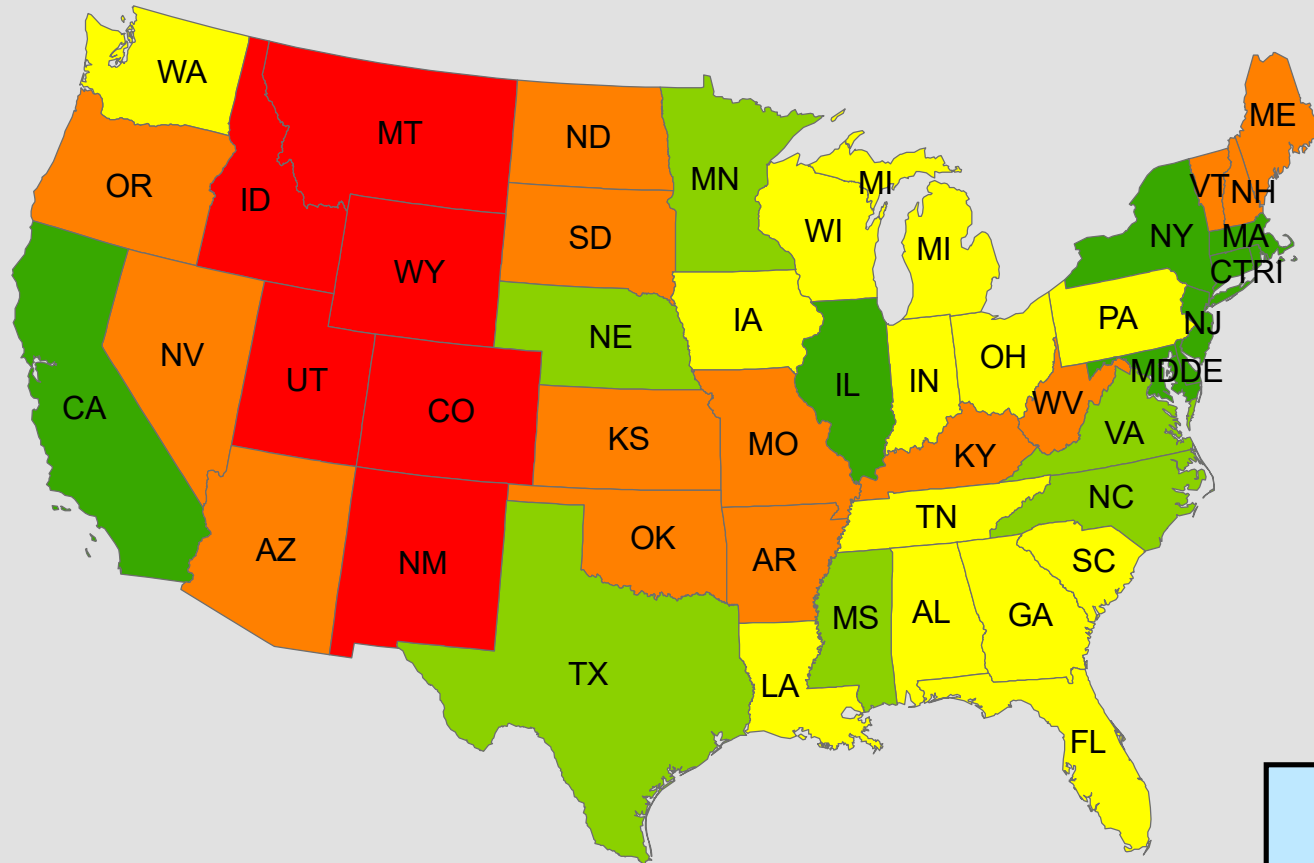

- The rate of suicide is highest in middle-age white men in particular.
- In 2017, men died by suicide 3.54x more often than women.
- On average, there are 129 suicides per day.
- White males accounted for 69.67% of suicide deaths in 2017.
- In 2017, firearms accounted for 50.57% of all suicide deaths.
